House Armed Services Committee, and talked with him at some length about	
the Proxmire amendments to the National Security Act as contained in the	
Military Procurement his passed by the Senate. Slatinshek said it now	
appeared quite likely that the House conferees would insist on striking the	
entire Proxmire amendment on the question of germaneness. I said the Director	эr
was in favor of including the Proxmire amendment so long as the question of	
our domestic activities was covered by some language in the conference	
report. I told Slatinshek we did not want to get in between the Senate and	
House Committees on this issue but I said I understood Senator Stennis planned
