

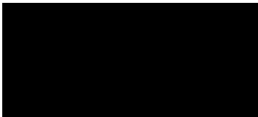

1. [redacted] reported that the New York police inquiry regarding Mr. [redacted] concerned a late registration for voting purposes and was entirely all right. 25X1A9a

2. [redacted] telephoned regarding the [redacted] accounting of funds. Apparently there is on file in the Agency sufficient information to answer all of our questions. With the exception of changing [redacted]'s memorandum, Bob believes that the entire thing can be accomplished by merely rewriting the original memorandum signed by Mr. Wisner. I told him to undertake this right away and that we could wait until [redacted] returned to change his memorandum.

3. Signed travel orders for six Procurement and Supply people to go to the Far East to set up logistics procedures and implement the provisions of the Supply Manual. This has been concurred in by the Far East Division and [redacted]. 25X1A9a

4. [redacted] requested permission to make a Senior Representative, rather than an Assistant Director, responsible for approving or disapproving of the sale of automobiles transported to overseas stations at Government expense. I told him that, obviously, the point of the regulation was to insure that individuals did not transport cars at Government expense and then sell them at considerable profit in foreign areas and that I thought as long as we serviced this principle no one would object as to whether it was done by an Assistant Director or a Senior Representative.

5. Bob Macy, Bureau of the Budget, telephoned requesting that Mr. George Schwarzwald be cleared for general discussions where our activities come up in connection with the National Security Council, Psychological Strategy Board, and the Department of State. He emphasized that he did not want or intend that Mr. Schwarzwald should become involved in our budget in any detail. I did not admit that I had ever heard of Mr. Schwarzwald and told Mr. Macy that Mr. Wolf would call him on 16 October. (This has been done.) 25X1A2d1

6. [redacted] Security Officer at [redacted], was in to talk to me about [redacted] concerning whom [redacted] is interested. I told [redacted] that while [redacted] is highly competent professionally I would like [redacted] to contact me personally before employing him and that it would be far better if Mr. [redacted] could be employed on a project with which CIA had no connection. I have also discussed this with Colonel Edwards who concurs in my action. 25X1A9a
