DEPUTIES' MEETING

Friday, 25 November 1955

Mr. Dulles:

a. Discussed a 3 October message from [REDACTED] 25X1A6a
regarding establishment of credits for crude oil. Asked DD/I
to look into the matter in coordination with Mr. [REDACTED] 25X1A9a
(This was furnished by DD/I later.)

b. Stated he was seeing Rudolph A. Winnacker and asked
Mr. Amory and Dr. Kent to be present.

c. Discussed IN 33160 from [REDACTED] 25X1A6a
and asked DD/P to
report to him on this.

d. Asked Mr. [REDACTED] 25X1A9a
to report to him on Monday on the
(International Communism) paper.

e. Referred to a letter from Park Armstrong requesting
a crash estimate. Mr. Amory stated this was in hand. General
Cabell stated he felt the military aid portion should be
included, that we should not accept the full charge but require
participation by the aid people. Mr. Amory undertook to re-
examine the terms of reference. Mr. Dulles stated he would
not object to having [REDACTED] and ICA represented when the
IAC considers this estimate.

f. Discussed the [REDACTED] 25X1A6a report from [REDACTED] 25X1A9a
on the [REDACTED] matter and said he would like to have General Cabell
look into this for him. He was particularly concerned that
where we were serving as a channel of communication we were
accused of being "instigators of the plot".

g. Commented on an ORR memo to ICA and objected to
including the Aswan Dam under the item "known offers which
will probably be accepted". Mr. Amory agreed to modify this.

h. Referred to a memorandum of 18 November from [REDACTED] 25X1A9a
on the abolition of the PCG and passed this to Mr. [REDACTED] for
comment. 25X1A9a

i. Asked Mr. [REDACTED] 25X1A9a
to have a recommendation to him by
Monday of CIA representation on a select committee to revise

PSB-D-23 of 1953 dealing with the SEATO problem. (Basis for this conversation was letter from [REDACTED], 21 November, Top Secret).

j. Asked General Cabell to look over IN 33721 and discuss with him.

k. Asked Gen. Cabell to discuss with [REDACTED] 25X1A9a an additional Agreed Activities matter.

l. Asked Mr. [REDACTED] 25X1A9a to give him a report by Wednesday on cable IN 33344 dealing with the effectiveness of [REDACTED] 25X6 political support.

m. Reported that Congressman Judd was very gloomy about the Burma picture and read from State cable 580 from Rangoon which he asked Mr. Amory to give to Sherman Kent.

n. Says he considers the Afghanistan situation the most worrisome one at the present time and would hate to wake up some morning to read in the papers that it had gone behind the Iron Curtain. Mr. Bissell remarked it would be worse if he woke up some morning to find it had gone behind the Iron Curtain without any publicity -- that if such a thing happens, at least we could salvage some world opinion by thoroughly publicizing the matter. Mr. Dulles said he intended to give a thorough briefing on Thursday, complete with charts and maps, on the Afghanistan situation and would like to discuss it at the IAC on Tuesday and generally make the topic a matter of urgency. 25X1A9a Mr. [REDACTED] said he would ask [REDACTED] for their comments. 25X1A

o. Asked Mr. Kirkpatrick to be sure that we contact Congressmen who have returned from trips where we know they have expressed particular interest in an area so that in our approach to them they will be aware we have followed them in their course of travels.

General Cabell:

Reported that he had a discussion with AEC representatives on the matter of CIA clearances and found it very discouraging. Generally AEC takes the position that they do not know whether current law permits them to make such an arrangement but they would not object to a ruling of the Attorney General which stated the law would permit the arrangement. They would object to a revision of current law. Mr. Houston is writing up an attorney's brief on the matter.

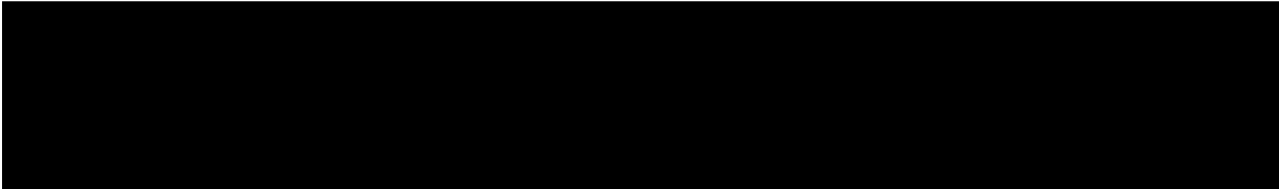
Col. White:
