c) Noted his intention of raising at the next OCB meeting the fact that U.S. officials stationed in iron curtain countries are not talking and fraternizing with the people of the country to which they are accredited and as a result we are failing to

obtain a good deal of intelligence information. The Director said he realized this problem presents a problem within itself since in a number of these countries the locals are prohibited from talking to Americans. Mr. Kirkpatrick pointed out that in a recent conversation with a returning newspaperman from Moscow he had been advised that apparently Amb. Bohlen had put some restraint on Embassy officials talking with U. S. reporters in Moscow.

d) Noted a cable from [redacted] containing information on the current situation in [redacted] and asked AD/CI to include a roundup on that country in an early edition of the CIB.

Mr. Amory:

Noted an article in today's New York Herald Tribune indicating that technical and scientific intelligence on Soviet aviation advances is not reaching our manufacturers and in particular that "CIA should be thoroughly briefed by the industry on what items are important" and commented this was not true since the Air Force and we are constantly in touch with the Air industry. General Cabell noted that Gen. Samford, when Director of Intelligence, USAF, had turned down requests for briefings by the Aircraft manufacturers and had indicated to him (General Cabell) that this was the responsibility of CIA. General Cabell said he had advised General Samford that this was not our business. After some discussion General Cabell recommended that this problem be placed before the IAC. The Director agreed.
