a) Stated that [redacted] had been anxious to get together with him and talk about the present Hungarian situation. Mr. Kirkpatrick advised that he was going to New York this week and would be happy to see [redacted] on DCI's behalf. ACTION: IG

b) Referred to several cables from [redacted] which were in the nature of news roundups from various press accounts of the Hungarian and Polish situations. He suggested that COP request the [redacted] station to slow down on straight news accounts but to keep reporting any information developing on the names of Hungarian leaders of the present revolt. ACTION: COP



d) Stated that he wished to review our communications facilities and any problems therewith on a worldwide basis in the immediate future and asked Col. White to get started on this. Mr. Kirkpatrick commented that steps had already been initiated in this matter and that he had received a memorandum from [redacted] which outlines where we are in excellent shape and where we do lack certain facilities. Corrective measures in problem areas will be taken as soon as possible.

Mr. Amory:

Referred to the forthcoming trip of the IAC members to CONAD scheduled for 1 and 2 November, and suggested that in view of the present world situation consideration should be given to postponing this trip until a later date. It was agreed that this matter would be discussed at the IAC on 30 October.
