1. Gordon Stewart telephoned to say that he would like to present our new flexible T/O proposal to the Civil Service Commissioners and to Messrs. Siciliano and Winslow of the White House to get their general reaction. I told him that I thought this would be a good idea.

[redacted] reported that he had had a talk with Mr. Tarwater, who has replaced Mr. Spelman at the Bureau of Public Roads, and that he appeared to be sympathetic to our request to use a part of the George Washington Memorial Parkway for our construction traffic. Tentatively [redacted] plans to go to Richmond on the 24th to discuss this with Mr. Davis, the State Highway Commissioner. I told him that I would be glad to go with him if he thought it would serve any useful purpose.

I talked to [redacted] again about the cost of the Director's Mess and emphasized that I thought he was extremely vulnerable if he did not arrive at some arrangement whereby the cost of all of the food was paid for by the people who ate it. He agreed with this but said that the General Counsel and the Chief, Audit Staff had approved of the arrangement under which they were now working. I re-emphasized that regardless of what they had okayed he, alone, was fully responsible.
