CIA Believes Fall of Saigon Is Inevitable

WASHINGTON—The Central Intelligence Agency believes the fall of South Vietnam is only a matter of time and that Communist forces will mount a major attack against Saigon within two weeks.

A House foreign affairs subcommittee heard the bleak assessment from a CIA official Wednesday behind closed doors.

A source said that the official termed the Communist capture of Xuan Loc, 40 miles northeast of Saigon, inevitable


"We were told that that will free three to four North-Vietnamese combat divisions, which are expected to move in concert with another division against Saigon from the north and west," the source said. "Intensive fighting is expected to begin in the next couple of weeks."

The certainty that South Vietnam will fall was described as "final," the source said. The only question is when." The CIA official reportedly said that, if Congress granted President Ford's request for \$722 million in additional military aid, there was a chance that the Saigon government could survive perhaps through the fiscal year, which ends June 30.

The source said South Vietnamese President Nguyen Van Thieu was described by the CIA official as "ineffective politically from any perspective—in military, religious and academic circles."

But the CIA official "seemed to imply that as long as Thieu held power and was predisposed to fight, we would Support him," the source said.

The official reportedly said that the U.S. government is exploring no alternatives to a military conclusion to the war, such as encouragement of a political settlement by the replacement of the Thieu government.
