He reacted strongly and insisted that they should be permitted to review our material in order to assure themselves that we are not holding anything back. He added that they would put their request for additional material made yesterday in writing and he insisted that the Agency make clear its position in writing.

the depth of the cuts in the Defense appropriations by the House Committee
have been so great that the Administration was re-thinking its position on the
matter and the Director was not in a position to meet with the Chairman
at this time.
