11. [Redacted] [Redacted] former Agency employee, called and said he had received a form letter from Representative Michael Harrington containing a plea for contributions to the Fund for Peace. Also enclosed was a pamphlet entitled "CIA Covert Action Threat to the Constitution." He said it is full of inaccuracies. [Redacted] was furious and wanted to know if he should go ahead and answer the letter or if we would want it. I said I would pass this on to Mr. Cary and he would be back in touch.

12. [Redacted] Accompanied the Director, Mr. Knoche and [Redacted] to a meeting with the Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations With Respect to Intelligence Activities. See Memo for Record.

13. [Redacted] Met separately with Chairman Lucien Nedzi and Mr. Jack Boos, ~~House Select Committee on Intelligence~~, to bring them up to date concerning our recent appearances before the Senate Select Committee. Mr. Nedzi mentioned that he might want to have the Director appear before the House Select Committee in open session soon after the present recess to give an idea of what the Agency is all about to the extent this is possible in an open session. I told him I would pass this word to the Director.

25X1 19. [redacted] Charles Snodgrass, House Appropriations Committee staff, called and asked that the Director's briefing on the Agency budget be rescheduled for 11 June at 10:00. He said the time was not negotiable as far as Chairman George Mahon was concerned and he hoped it was acceptable to the Director.

25X1 21. [redacted] Helen Boyle, in the office of Representative George Mahon (D., Texas), called concerning the status of the application of [redacted]. She said he was interviewed in Austin some months ago. I told her I would check and get back in touch with her.

25X1 22. [redacted] Saw Searle Field, House Select Committee staff, who said he would like a briefing session possibly next week and wants to set up briefings for the full Committee at Headquarters as soon as possible for educational purposes.

25X1 23. [redacted] Met with Clark McFadden, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, and advised him of yesterday's session with the Senate Select Committee. McFadden is still very concerned about the NID.

[redacted] Met with Allen Rexinger, Legislative Assistant to Representative Robert McClory (R., Ill.), and left with him a copy of the paper "Restless Youth-1968" (the unclassified version) which he had requested for the Representative. I told him there were two other versions of the paper; one sanitized and the original classified one which contained some source information. He said, as we had expected, that the unclassified version would serve their purpose but he would check with Mr. McClory.
