[Redacted] AGENCY VISITS Ed Braswell and Clark McFadden, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, visited Agency Headquarters from about 10:15 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. during which time they saw movies on Mr. Duckett's project; were updated on the status of the Select Committees' investigations; met with the Director to review possible Committee action on legislation, and were briefed by [Redacted] OSR, on the Soviet surveillance capability [Redacted] This appeared to be a very informative session for both of them. A follow-up item is to provide Braswell, for Senator John C. Stennis (D., Miss.), whatever unclassified material we have on world resource shortages. Braswell already has the unclassified paper on food production.
