25X1 1. [redacted] Called Mrs. Ann Bolten, in the office of Representative Edward Derwinski (R., Ill.), and told her we would like to arrange to see the Congressman as a follow up to his trip to Yugoslavia. I told her we had talked with him before he left and expressed an interest in talking to him when he returned. She said she would talk to the Congressman and call me back to set a date.

25X1 2. [redacted] Called Frank Sullivan, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, and asked what his reaction was to the paper on Vietnam. I said the Director would like to see this in the Congressional Record without comment and asked if he thought Senator Sam Nunn (D., Ga.) would consider doing it. Sullivan said he thought the Senator would. He said he thought Michael Getler's treatment in his column this morning was pretty good. He said he thought Representative Les Aspin (D., Wis.) released the paper to Getler.

Later in the day, Sullivan called to say the paper was inserted in today's Congressional Record.

25X1 3. [redacted] Called Clark McFadden, General Counsel, Senate Armed Services Committee, about a report I had received that Senator John Stennis (D., Miss.) had asked GAO to do some sort of a study on NRO. I said I couldn't believe Senator Stennis would ask GAO to get involved in that program. McFadden said it was news to him but he will check into it. He said they can't get GAO to do things for them because they are always tied up in things like this but will let me know.

McFadden said Stennis would like a copy of [redacted] notes on the 13 March 1973 meeting with Senator Frank Church on his Chile hearings and I told him I delivered those to Ed Braswell, Chief Counsel and Staff Director of the Committee, last week.

25X1 4. [redacted] Rebecca Switzer, on the staff of Representative Anthony Moffett (D., Conn.), called to request that the Congressman be placed on the subscription list for all the [redacted] I explained to her that all the volumes constitute a consideration volume of information to review each day. She said, nevertheless, we should send them and I called [redacted] to make the necessary arrangements.

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5. [redacted] Talked to Jim Menke, in the office of Representative Patsy Mink (D., Hawaii), and told him that when I spoke to her yesterday (he was on the phone too) she asked if she needed to send a letter regarding [redacted] I said because of the involvement and technicalities of this subject matter it would be best if she did follow up with a letter. I said meanwhile we will get started on the question she asked [redacted]

25X1A 6. [redacted] Frank Slatinshek, Chief Counsel, House Armed Services Committee, called and asked if we had given them anything on H. Res. 205 and I informed him that [redacted] had handcarried the letter addressed to Chairman Melvin Price plus attachments to Slatinshek on Friday, 28 February. Slatinshek said they couldn't find anything and asked that we send him another copy.

25X1A 7. [redacted] [redacted] and I met with Jack Boos, House Armed Services Committee staff, for the purpose of introducing [redacted] to Boos and initiating discussions relating to the inquiry of the House Select Committee on Intelligence. (See [redacted] Memorandum for the Record.)

25X1A 8. [redacted] Met with Max Friedersdorf, White House staff, to brief him on access to certain compartmented information and obtain execution of the appropriate secrecy agreements. [redacted] joined us and at his request I then met with [redacted] and Phillip Buchen, Counsel to the President, to discuss several mutual problems. (See Memorandum for the Record.)

9. [redacted] Joan Eigelsbach, on the staff of Senator Jacob K. Javits (R., N. Y.), called and asked for two [redacted] reports mentioning the Senator's name. One was an article in "Izvestiya" on 6 May 1971 entitled "The Senator from Tel Aviv;" the other was a Tass summary of the article the following day. I checked the Senator's file and discovered that we had delivered these two items to the Senator's office on 12 May. I also called [redacted] and obtained the date and page in which these reports appeared in the [redacted] I attempted to reach Ms. Eigelsbach at her office but she was out so I left word for her to call.

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
