Agreement Between CIA and Secret Service

We have no one detailed at the moment to the Secret Service as the need for such details is usually incident to inauguration, death of a President, or foreign visitation of such magnitude that the Secret Service needs additional assistance. Public Law 90-331 directs Federal departments and agencies, when requested by the Director of the United States Secret Service, to assist the Secret Service in the performance of its protective duties. This authority of the Director, United States Secret Service remains in force unless revoked by the President. We have attached a copy of the Public Law as well as the agreement between this Agency and the Secret Service which was most recently signed in the fall of 1971.
