# I. INTRODUCTION

### A. Purpose of Summary

The purpose of this brief is to set forth in a summary form available data about the organization and personnel connected with the various Trade Union Internationals or Trade Departments of the World Federation of Trade Unions and the methods and aims of the WFTU program as it will be carried on by these Trade Departments. These organizations, as is generally known, have been newly created by the Secretariat of the WFTU as a result of the failure of the WFTU to incorporate within its fold as Trade Departments, the sixteen non-Communist International Trade Secretariats already in existence. The failure has been ascribed to differeces with regard to financing, the reluctance of the Secretariats to jeopardize their independence, and their apprehension of the political ideology of the WFTU.

#### B. WFTU Structure

The sovereign authority of the World Federation of Trade Unions is the World Trade Union Congress which convenes biennially. Provision is made, however, for the holding of extraordinary congresses. Representation and voting power at the Congress varies with membership according to an agreed-upon scale. The Constitution of the WFTU also provides for a General Council, an Executive Committee and an Executive Bureau. The General Council is elected by the Congress and each affiliated organization is represented on it according to its numerical strength. The Council is the governing body of the Federation in the periods between congresses. Its functions include those of approving the annual budget and electing the General Secretary. It meets at least once a year. The Executive Committoe, also elected by the Congress, is the governing body of the Federation in the periods between meetings of the General Council and meets not less than twice a year. The Executive Bureau is elected by the Executive Committee. It is composed of a Chairman ( or President) and seven Vice-Chairmen ( or Vice-Presidents) and is the governing body of the Federation



between meetings of the Executive Committee. The Executive Bureau appoints the assistant general secretaries to serve under the direction of the General Secretary in the permanent Secretariat.\*

The Secretariat is presently composed of the following elements:

- 1. General Secretary: Louis SAILLANT.
- Assistant General Secretary: Sergie ROSTOVSKY, who heads the Department of Relations with the National Centers, Press and Information.
- 3. Assistant General Secretary: Boleslaw GERERT, who directs the Department of Trade Departments (T.U.I.'s).
- An incumbent would manage the Economic and Social Department.

  According to a WFTU bulletin, the office of the director of the Economic and Social Department is being reserved for a representative of the British and American workers when they again become affiliated to the WFTU. In addition to the three departments listed above, there are Departments in the Secretariat for Accountants, Translations and Shorth and and typing.

With a representative of the Soviet trade unions in the key position of director of the Department of Relations with the National Centres, Press and Information, it is obvious how strong a control the U.S.S.R. has in the Secretariat of the WFTU.

### C. WFTU Liaison Bureaus

### 1. Liaison Bureau for Asia

Liaison Bureaus are being organized by the WFTU to unify and extend its command over labor forces through the world. At the Asian Trade Union Conference in Pei-P'ing which was held in November 1949, a WFTU Liasion Bureau for Asia was founded. During the conference, measures in various

forms were drawn up for the purpose of:

- a. urging workers of Asian countries to take up arms for national liberation;
- b. requesting workers of the capitalist nations United States, Britain, France, and the Netherlands to demand the recall of their countries' troops from, and otherwise oppose military intervention in, Korea, Malaya, Indochina and Indonesia;
- c. asking the Trade Unions of France, Turkey, Salvador, India, Australia and the Philippines to demand the withdrawal of their representation from the U.N. Commission on Korea;
- d. protesting the action of SCAP preventing Japanese delegates from from attending the Pei-P'ing conference.

The Liaison Bureau for Asia is to consist of four members with one each representing the All-China Federation of Labor, the All-Indian Trade Union Congress, the Soviet Trade Unions and the Australian Trade Unions. The Bureau members are, respectively:

The headquarters of the Bureau will be in China, and the Chinese trade representative will serve as chairman.

The functions of the Liaison Bureau for Asia were described at the Pei-P'ing conference by Soviet delegate L.N. SOLOVYOV (or SOLOVEV) and can be summarized as follows:

- to assist trade unions of the area in explaining and carrying out the decisions of the WFTU Executive. To circulate widely information on all WFTU activity and aims;
- 2) to collect information for the WFTU on trade union activity in the Asian countries;
- to extend WFTU membership by establishing contacts in non-affiliated unions and to fight divisionist activity;



- 4) Representatives of the Bureau are to take part in meetings of the national trade union centrals and of the trade unions and federations;
- 5) The Liaison Bureau will submit to the Executive Bureau of the WFTU every three months, a complete report on its activity.
- 6) The Liaison Bureau, as a working body of the WFTU, is not to act as a block between the WFTU and the national trade union centers.

  The latter have the right and duty to maintain direct relations with the WFTU Executive.

#### 2. Liaison Bureau for Latin America

According to a WFTU publication, the CTAL (Confederation of Workers of Latin America) has been designated by the WFTU Executive to serve as WFTU Liaison Bureau for Latin America. One of the resolutions made by the WFTU Executive Committee during the May 1950 Conference at Budapest reads:

"The Executive Committee proposes to the secretariat of the WFTU that it support the work done by the T.U.I.'s in the colonial and dependent countries; that in its work of organization it avail itself of the Asiatic and Latin-American Liaison Bureaus of the WFTU;".

While the task of organizing labor groups into effective components of the WFTU, is an important function of the CTAL; a second function, the collection of information for the WFTU, appears to be equally as essential. The CTAL conference which took place at Montevideo, Uruguay, 27-31 March, 1950, was designated a "Conference of Information" by the WFTU Secretariat. According to one report, the delegations of the participating countries were directed to bring information, prepared within their own countries, based on the following guide:

"Production; industrial development; agricultural problems; wages (statistics for the last five years); prices (food, housing, transportation, clothing, entertainment, etc.); degree of imperialist penetration -- in industry, commerce, agriculture, economy of the state, the administrative machinery, and in the defense of the country, treaties signed, most current forms of penetration;

monetary situation; State Budget -- how is it distributed among the various ministries; program of claims -- in the economic, political and social fields; experiences of strikers' struggles; defense of the national economy -- in which case was there a united action of the proletariat, of other economic sectors, what were the results; trade union organizational experiences; trade union unity (committee of community action, fight in common with various trade unions; what influence does the CTAL and WFTU have and what is their duty?"

The highly diversified information targets sought by the WFTU -- some of which are quite unrelated to trade union activity and interest, (such as information concerning the State budget, treaties with the "imperialists") are clearly indicated in this outline.

#### 3. Liaison Bureau for Africa

At the Budapest Conference of Trade Union Internationals, May 1950, a proposal was made that the WFTU organize rapidly and carefully an African Trade Union Conference for the early establishment of a Bureau of Information, Liaison, and Coordination for Africa. M.CARROUE, Vice-President of the Agricultural and Forestry Workers' T.U.I. stated that such action is very necessary in view of the "increased imperialist penetration through investments in application of TRUMAN's Point 4, while Africa is being transformed into a base of aggression for the imperialist war plans."

### D. Founding of the Trade Union Internationals

Organizational committees set up by the WFTU to prepare constituent conferences of international trade departments, met from 8 to 13 April 1949 in Paris. It was apparently decided to hold several of these conferences prior to and shortly after the WFTU Congress which took place in Milan, Italy, from 29 June to 10 July 1949. The rapidity with which the program has been implemented is probably dictated by a desire to begin an effectual organizational drive before the non-Communist labor movement

is in a position to establish effective international controls. Twelve of the Trade Union Internationals have been founded and in May 1950 sent representatives to a Consulatative Conference at Budapest where their activities and tasks were reviewed.

The Trade Union Internationals which have been founded to date are the following:

Detailed information on the trade union internationals listed above appears in the sections which follow; four additional trade union internationals have been planned, but have not as yet been constituted:

#### E. Structure of the T.U.I.'s

A pattern of organization for the administration of the various Trade Union Internationals was apparently prescribed by the WFTU Secretariat and has been followed by the Trade Union Internationals thus far constituted. The Trades Conference of the individual Trade Union International is its chief authority. It is to be convoked every two years. The functions of the Seamen and Dockers Trades Conference are outlined in Article V of the Statutes of that T.U.I. (see Appendix A). The Trades Conference elects the Administrative and Auditing Committees, pro-rating

the number of members among the affiliated organizations. The Administrative Committee directs the activities of the Trade Union International between sessions of the Trades Conference. The responsibilities of an Administrative Committee are described in Article IX of Appendix A. The Administrative Committees consist of a President, two or three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary General and anywhere from six to twelve committee members. The officers of these committees (President, Vice-Presidents, and Secretary General) form the Administrative Bureau. The Auditing Committees examine and certify the accounts and submit their reports to the Administrative Committee and to the Trades Conference.

The headquarters of the individual T.U.I. appears to be permanently staffed by the Secretary General and a few assistants. The Secretary in nearly every case is a citizen of the country where the headquarters of the T.U.I. is located. The members of the Administrative Bureaus and the Committees appear to convene only periodically. At the Sudapest conference in May 1950, more "collective work between members of the Administrative Committees" was advocated.

#### F. Functions and Objectives of the Trade Union Internationals

Explicit statements setting forth the functions, activities, objectives and methods of the Trade Union Internationals appear in the May 1950 issue of the WFTU bulletin, <u>World Trade Union Movement</u>. These can be outlined and summarized in general as follows:

1) Each TUI must study and examine in detail the complex problems of its particular industry in the capitalist countries, the relation of the government and the employers to these problems, and the workers' exact situation; the T.U.I. must coordinate activities of the workers' struggle to attain their immediate objectives -- improved working and living standards, social security measures, etc. The T.U.I.'s must fight against speedup of work processes.

- 2) The T.U.I.'s must organize effective solidarity in the respective trade for workers on strike. An example cited where effective solidarity was demonstrated was the support given to the strikers at the Michelin rubber and tire factory in France by the T.U.I. of Chemical Workers.
- 3) Information bulletins should be published outlining workers' problems and supporting the struggle for "proletarian internationalism", solidarity of workers, the struggle against splitters and strike breakers in the respective trade unions and the struggle against "war mongers" and in defense of peace.
- 4) The Administrative Committees of the T.U.I.'s should convene conferences of workers employed by the same international trust or cartel in order to work out a common program of demands.
- 5) The T.U.I.'s should assist the unions of Asia, Africa, and Latin America in the formation of national unions where only local unions have existed.
- 6) The T.U.I.'s must constantly discredit the leaders of non-Communist unions, described in a WFTU bulletin as "socialist splitters who are disrupting labor unity".
- 7) The T.U.I.'s must develop connections with progressive workers in capitalist countries where the "reactionary" trade union leaders have withdrawn from the WFTU and must make known to these workers the program of the WFTU for "international trade union unity and for peace". The practice should be made of inviting representatives of these outside trade unions as guests or observers to meetings, conferences and the sessions of the executive bodies of the T.U.I.'s. "Liaison committees" should be organized by the T.U.I.'s in capitalist countries to implement the work of splitting the "bourgeois" organizations.

- 8) The T.U.I.'s must fight for the defense of peace by energetically coordinating and popularizing the activities of Permanent Committees for the Defense of Peace in the workshops.
- 9) There should be closer coordination between some of the more important T.U.I.'s -- such as the Metal Workers' T.U.I., Scamen and Dockers' T.U.I., and certain others, with all other workers fighting against war preparations. A proposal to coordinate activities of certain T.U.I.'s with those of youth and student groups in opposing war preparations was made at the May 1950 conference.
- 10) The T.U.I.'s should examine and publicize "industry by industry the repercussions and effects of the Marshall Plan, Clayton Plan ...
  ....and all other plans for world domination and expose them down to the smallest detail".

### G. WFTU Direction of Trade Union Internationals

Close coordination of T.U.I. activity by the WFTU had been provided at the Second World Congress in Milan in 1949. The Congress had authorized the Executive Committee, at its first meeting in 1950, to complete the election of two more Executive Committee members and three substitutes from candidates nominated by the T.U.I.'s which would then be in existence. One T.U.I. representative, Ernest THORNTON, of the Metal Workers' T.U.I., had been elected to the Executive Committee of the WFTU at the Milan Congress. At the Budapest Conference therefore, the following candidates were nominated and, in the usual manner, were "endorsed unanimously":

Members: ELLIOTT, E.V., of the Seamen's and Dockers' T.U.I.

LI Chich-po, of the Land and Air Transport Workers' T.U.I.

Substitutes: BOSI, Ilio, of the Agricultural and Forestry Workers' T.U.I.

Two more substitutes, representing the Textile and Clothing Workers' T.U.I.

and the Miners' T.U.I. are to be designated by their respective organizations.

Criticism of Boleslaw GEBERT's work in directing the Department of Trade Departments was voiced by several T.U.I. officers at the Budapest Conference.



Henri JOURDAIN, Secretary of the Metal and Engineering Workers' T.U.I., stated that the help and guidance given by the WFTU Secretariat to the T.U.I.'s was "quite inadequate" and that the general directives issued to the T.U.I.'s by the Secretariat were both belated and insufficient.

F. MAURICE, President of the Leather, Shoe and Fur Workers' T.U.I., and Y.BEREZIN, Vice-President of the Metal and Engineering T.U.I. were also openly critical of CEBERT. BEREZIN specifically requested that the WFTU Executive direct the "practical day to day work" of the T.U.I.'s. This dissatisfaction with GEBERT's service may lead to a strengthening of his staff to enable it to give more effective direction to T.U.I. activity, or could possibly lead to the replacement of GEBERT as director of the Department of Trade Departments.

### H. Comparison of WFTU and Profintern Structures

The charts in Appendix C showing the organizations of the defunct Profintern (Red International of Labor Unions) and the WFTU indicate certain factors common to both bodies. The Profintern's use of auxiliary organizations such as the International of Scamen and Harbor Workers and the Pan-Pacific Trade Union Secretariat to attain world-wide control of labor organizations is comparable to the WFTU's present and contemplated use of Liaison Bureaus and certain key Trade Union Federations to realize such scope. The functions of the Red or Revolutionary Trade Union Oppositions of the Profintern were generally to organize and promote Communist propaganda among workers, to initiate and supervise Communist splinter groups, to penetrate "reformist" trade unions, etc. At the May 1950 Consultative Conference of Trade Departments of the WFTU in Budapest, although the primary importance of attaining the immediate needs of the workers was stressed, it was pointed out that the Trade Departments should "link" these immediate aims to the broader objectives of the WFTU -- "the defense of trade union rights, democratic liberties and peace". The Trade Departments, as has been stated above, have been directed to set up "Peace Committees" in every factory -- groups which in the Western countries would

obviously be an indirect support for any Soviet or Communist move, and whose propaganda, although in a more subtle presentation, parallels the propaganda activities of the Trade Union Oppositions of the Profintern. The Department of Relations with the National Centres, Press and Information in the Secretariat of the WFTU is divided into five geographic

bureaus, reminiscent of the regional secretariats of the Profintern.

### I. Clandestine Aspects of the WFTU Program

In effecting the establishment and development of contacts with workers in countries where the trade union centers are not affiliated to the WFTU, activity toward which the T.U.I.'s were directed to pay "particular attention", it is realized that many of these contacts will be of an unofficial and more or less covert nature. To date, only a few of such contacts have come to attantion. The Industrial Organizer of the British Communist Party, George ALLISON, is known to have had talks in Paris with WFTU officials for the purpose of assisting the WFTU to acquire a footing in Great Britain. It was agreed that certain Party members in the various industries would act as contacts with the related T.U.I.'s. Such contacts have reportedly been set up in Britain for the Scamen and Dockers' T.U.I. and for the Metal and Engineering T.U.I., while others have already been considered. In April 1950, Alphonse DROUARD, President of the Land and Air Transport Workers' T.U.I., tried to visit Britain, but was refused permission to enter the country. Recently one NAHON, a courier of the Seamen and Dockers T.U.I. went from Doker to Latin America and was arrested in Uruguay. The numerous addresses found in his possession show how extensive his mission was.

In view of the emphasis placed upon the importance of developing contacts with workers in capitalist countries, it is most likely that more and more of these contacts will be made clandestinely in order to spread WFTU and Communist propaganda among workers in western countries. It may also be assumed that the T.U.I.'s will have a share in the co-ordination of industrial sabotage during the current crisis, particularly in

connection with the "Peace Campaign". Definite evidence to this effect, however, is lacking.

### J. Importance of Colonial Areas to WFTU Program

Considerable emphasis was put by several of the speakers at the Budapest Conference of May 1950 on increased T.U.I. work in colonial and semi-colonial areas. M. CARROUE, Vice-President of the Agricultural and Forestry Workers' T.U.I. proposed that the T.U.I. Conference ask the WFTU to:

- "organize rapidly and carefully the African Trade Union Conference which should include observers from all interested T.U.I.'s;
- 2. establish a "Bureau of Information, Liaison and Coordination for Africa."

The African delegate, Abdoulaye DIALLO, Vice-President of the WFTU and member of the Postal Workers' T.U.I., urged that efforts be made to organize into the appropriate T.U.I. port workers along the western coast of Africa in the Cameroons, Nigeria and other countries, and railwaymen, miners, and postal workers.

The "Asian Liaison Bureau" at Pei-P'ing would continue to centralize the WFTU-T.U.I. work in that part of the world. Ernest THORNTON, Vice-President of the Metal Workers' T.U.I., emphasized that the work in Asia should be in concrete, specific support of the insurrectionary movements in Indo China, Malaya, the Philippines "and others". "When addressing the Asiatic workers therefore, the T.U.I.'s could not limit their action to abstract appeals against war generally," advised THORNTON.

#### K. Increasing Significance of T.U.I.'s

Direct organizational support will undoubtedly be given the T.U.I.'s by the WFTU. The necessity for doing this was pointed out at Budapest by Henri JOURDAIN, Secretary of the Metal and Engineering Vorkers' T.U.I.:

"The main activity of the WFTU leadership should bear on guiding the Trade Union Internationals."



He proposed that the WFTU should:

"delogate some comrades capable of advising the leadership of the respective T.U.I.'s ...... particular effort should be made at least for the most important T.U.I.'s, those which play a decisive role in connection with the struggle for Peace and for International Trade Union unity."

DI VITTORIO, in his closing speech, endorsed JOURDAIN's proposal.

Inasmuch as it could be assumed that the national affiliates of the WFTU (such as the CGT, CGIL, etc.) were fairly self-sufficient in "resources and the necessary personnel to fulfill their own tasks, ...it would therefore be correct for the Executive Committee of the WFTU to give more assistance, attention, material, moral and financial aid and help in leadership to the Trade Union Internationals."

The decisions of the WFTU leadership in this matter are not yet known, but it appears probable that professional WFTU organizers and propagandists will be assigned to work directly on the T.U.I.'s and that WFTU funds will be put directly to the used of those considered most important

APPENDIX A, reproducing the statutes of the Seamen and Dockers T.U.I., indicates that the following measures are contemplated for the part to be played by the T.U.I. in the implementation of major Communist policies:

- strikes, demonstrations, and the distribution of propaganda
  in the ports and aboard ships in support of the anti-MDAP
  campaign, the "peace offensive" and of strikes, etc., engaged
  in by other Communist groups;
- 2) exchange of information, possibly to include maritime intelligence;
- 3) exchange of organizors, financial support, etc.;
- 4) establishment of seamen's clubs in the ports, libraries aboard ships, etc.

The importance of T.U.I. headquarters, as such, in the recent port activities against MDAP shipments, has not been clearly demonstrated.

Most of these activities appear to have been directed, not from T.U.I. headquarters at Marseille, but rather from national and local organizations of labor unions, such as the CGT, CGIL and their trades affiliates, or from Party offices themselves. If the Budapest decisions, calling for increased support to the T.U.I.'s are implemented, it may be expected

that the role of the Seamen and Dockers T.U.I. in the coordination of Communist maritime and port work will become greater. Its staff should certainly be expected to be enlarged and there may be a further increase in the attempts of this T.U.I. to set up secret contacts abroad (see introduction). Recent reports have indicated that the local authorities at Marseille will not recognize the legality of the T.U.I., and an as yet unconfirmed report has been received that the headquarters are to be transferred to Antwerp.

At the Constituent Conference, reports were presented by GEFERT and GUIDI and speeches were made by representatives of all delegations. The Conference adopted the draft Internal Regulations, programme and appeal to chemical workers throughout the world which had been prepared by the Commissions "elected for the purpose."

The following quotation is from <u>World Trade Union Movement</u>, April, 1950 issue, the bulletin of the WFTU:

"...The Trade Unions International of Workers in the Chemical Industries set itself the task of uniting all trade union organiations and workers in this industry, and in allied ones such as the pharmaceutical, paper, plastic, synthetic fibre, rubber, vegetable oils, fats and soap, glass and ceramic industries, without distinction of race, color, or political or religious opinion; of waging a persistent struggle against all those who are trying to break the unity of the workers' international organization; and of fighting for the interests of workers in these industries, for better working conditions and health protection. The Trade Unions International will fight for a stable, lasting and democratic peace, against the traitors to the working class and against the warmongers."

The Conference wired a message to the World Peace Committee in Stockholm. The message pointed out that the Works Committees for the Defence of Peace, set up by workers in the Chemical industries, have an important role to play "because of the very nature of these industries which are a basic factor in was preparations against which the working

The first conference of the Teachers' T.U.I. having large representation and following the pattern of the constituent conferences which were held by the other T.U.I.'s took place at Warsaw, Poland, from 12 to 17 August 1949. It was called the "Fifth Session of T.U.I. of Educational Workers", and was reportedly attended by 70 delegates of educational workers of 18 European and other countries, including the U.S.S.R., Yugoslavia, France, Austria, Belgium, New China, Korea, Viet Nam and others.

On the third day of the conference, Paul DELANOUE summed up the discussion. He stated that the teachers of capitalist and colonial countries on the one hand were under the pressure of reactionary agents acting under American monopolists' influence.

"The pressure is expressed by attacks on the material conditions of teachers, by restriction of freedom, racial discrimination and the attempt to isolate teachers from the working class. In Dec 1947, though reportedly not a Communist, he remained with the Confederation Generale du Travail and agreed to replace JOUHAUX in the Secretariat General. Reportedly under the influence of Louis SAILLANT. His wife is very likely a Communist. Vice President and member Executive Bureau of the W.F.T.U. Attended 10th Congress of the all Union Trade Unions in Moscow, April 1949; the WFTU Congress at Milan, June - July 1949; and the Pan-Asiatic Trade Union Congress at Peking, 15 - 22 November 1949.



That Conference proceeded to constitute the Trade Union International of Seamen, Dockers, River Workers, Fishermen, and Workers in ship construction and repair shops. It worked out the Statutes of the Trade Union International and drafted an Appeal to all the syndical organizations and to all the workers of the industries grouped within it.

The Secretariat of the WFTU transmits herewith the texts of the Statutes and the Appeal and requests that you - - -

- 1. Call together immediately conferences that are as large as possible, where reports on the Constituent Conference of Marseille and on the creation of the Trade Union International shall be presented, where its aims and its tasks shall be discussed, and where resolutions shall be adopted expressing the sentiments of the workers in the industries cited above vis-a-vis the Trade Union International which has just been created.
- 2. Diffuse the Appeal as widely as possible among the masses of the workers by inserting it in full or in part into all trade union publications and by organizing discussions and conferences, radio broadcasts, press conferences, and by utilizing any other means at your disposal.
- 3. Send to the temporary address below all minutes of the meetings, resolutions adopted, press releases, notes and articles in the newspapers and periodicals, devoted to the establishment of the Trade Union International.

In order to facilitate the rapid establishment of the Study, Documentation, and Information Service of the T.U.I., the Secretariat of the WFTU requests all National Labor Centers and all labor organizations to send regularly to the above address all statistics and information and all results of research and study likely to be of interest to the Unions and to the workers of the industries grouped within the T.U.I.

STATUTES OF THE SEAMEN AND DOCKERS' TUI (Trade Department of the WFTU)

#### PREAMBLE

In conformance with Article 13, Paragraph 1 of the Statutes of the WFTU, the Seamen and Dockers' TUI is established.

#### AIMS

- ARTICIE I: The TUI declares that its chief aims are the following:
- 1. To organize mutual international aid among the scamen, dockers, river workers, fishermen and port workers, as well as among their unions, in all countries, in order to assure fraternal cooperation and class solidarity in the struggle for the defense of the vital interests of these workers and of the peace of the world.
- 2. To defend and extend labor and social rights and democratic liberties of the workers in the maritime and river transport.
- 3. To defend and to assure the right to organize and to bargain collectively through freely chosen unions.
- 4. To ensure the application of the principle, "equal pay for equal work", for all maritime and river workers, regardless of race, color, or nationality. To establish minimum wage rates that will permit an adequate minimum standard of living; to assure a steady rise in real wages; and to define working conditions.

To see to it that these principles are applied particularly in colonial and semi-colonial countries.

- 5. To assure full employment and an equitable distribution of work.

  To safeguard union hiring halls and to establish new ones. To guarantee that the unions will have a decisive voice in the employment of laborers.

  To exercise a control over the number of workers employed in a given industry.
  - 6. To reduce the length of the working day.
  - 7. To obtain paid vacations and holidays.

- 8. To secure complete accident, old-age, and sickness insurance, and to obtain free medical aid.
- 9. To unite the seamen, dockers, and portworkers in their struggle against the employment of strike-breakers and of unqualified laborers hired at lower wages.
- 10. To improve working conditions on board ship and in the ports. To establish standards of sanitation and of nutrition on all ships and to set up cantines for port workers.
- 11. To introduce and secure the application of safety regulations. To obtain necessary safety devices and work clothes at the expense of the employers.
- 12. To fix a minimum size for crews and for gangs of dockers in the port as well as maximum loads they shall be required to carry.
  - 13. To prevent the use of corporal punishment by ships' masters.
- 14. To organize cultural, educational, and professional formations among the seamen, dockers, port workers, and others.
- 15. To open clubs, where seamen and dockers can meet for the better understanding of their respective problems and for the strengthening of their fraternal relations.

#### MEANS

ARTICLE II: The TUI in the name of the seamen and dockers, carries on its activity in the following ways:

- 1. By implementing the moral and material solidarity among the trade unions adhering to the TUI when the members of one of them enter into serious economic or social conflict.
  - 2. By work aimed at:
    - a) setting up unions of seamen, dockers, river workers and port workers in all countries;
    - achieving independence and democratic freedoms through the action of the unions of these workers where they are under the control of exploiters and of governments;

- c) strengthening the weaker unions.
- 3. By guaranteeing the representation of seamen, dockers, river workers and port workers in all appropriate international organizations and institutions.
- 4. By studying documents and statistics on the development of the maritime and river transport and of the unions of workers in them (wage scales, length of working day, conditions of employment, in each country).
- 5. By utilizing, distributing and exchanging these documents and statistics through all channels: publication of reports, bulletins, brochures; or by the organizing of conferences.

#### COMPOSITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL

ARTICLE III: Every organization of seamen, dockers, river workers and port workers, the National Headquarters of which is a member of the WFTU, is automatically affiliated with the International.

- 1. In a country
  - a) Where there is no Central National Union, or
  - b) Where a Central National Union is not affiliated with the WFTU a union of seamen, dockers, river workers and port workers can affiliate itself directly with the T.U.I.
- 2. The organizations directly affiliated with the T.U.I. enjoy the self-same rights and advantages as those whose National Headquarters adhere to the WFTU.
- 3. The T.U.I. comprises all the unions of workers in the following professions: seamen, dockers, fishermen and laborers and employees of ship-building and repair shops affiliated with the unions of seamen and dockers.

ARTICLE IV: The T.U.I. will be administered by:

- the Trades Conference
- the Administrative Committee



## THE TRADES CONFERENCE

#### FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE TRADES CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE V:

- 1. The Trades Conference will be the chief authority of the T.U.I.
- 2. It will be convoked every two years.
- 3. Its functions and powers will be the following:
  - a. To examine, discuss and decide -
    - (1) The reports of the Administrative Committee;
    - (2) The reports of the Auditors and supplementary reports presented on questions raised in the order of the day;
    - (3) All questions bearing on the interests of the seamen, dockers, river workers, fishermen and workers in ship-building and repair yards.
  - b. To determine the location of the Headquarters of the T.U.I.

    In case of necessity, the Trades Conference reserves for the

    Administrative Committee the right to determine this location.
  - c. To elaborate the program of the T.U.I. and to take all steps for its execution and for the execution of the decisions of the WFTU.
  - d. To revise the statutes of the T.U.I. when necessary.
  - c. To elect the Administrative Committee and the Auditors of the T.U.I., pro-rating the number of functionaries among the affiliated countries.
  - f. To set the date for the next Trades Conference.
  - g. Each affiliated organization brings to the attention of its members, as completely as possible, the deliberations of the Trades Conference in order to stimulate, amplify and extend their interest in the work of the T.U.I., and to develop international solidarity.

#### COMPOSITION OF THE TRADES CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE VI:

1. The Trades Conference shall be composed of delegates designated by their respective affiliated organizations on the following basis:

up to 10,000 members . . . . . . . . . one delegate

10,001 - 50,000. . . . . . . . . . one delegate for each additional block of 20,000 members (above the initial 10,000) or majority fraction thereof.

50,001 - 500,000 members . . . . . . . one delegate for each additional block of 50,000 members (above the initial 50,000 represented as abov or majority fraction thereof.

above 500,000 members. . . . . . one delegate for each additional block of 100,000 members or majority fraction thereof (above the initial 500,000 represented as above).

- 2. Upon agreement or upon the invitation of the Administrative Committee, the representatives of the unions of seamen, dockers, river workers, fishermen and portworkers not affiliated with the T.U.I. can, as observers, assist in the Trades Conference.
- 3. The expenses of each delegate will be born by the organization sending him.

#### REGULATIONS OF THE TRADES CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE VII:

- 1. The Conference shall ratify its order of the day set previously by the Administrative Committee and shall elect the following organs:
  - a. The Bureau, which shall generally include a President, three Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary. The Conference can, if necessary, enlarge or reduce the composition of this Bureau.
  - b. The Verification Commission, which shall examine the questions concerning the powers of the delegates and the validity of their mandates.

#### STORES

- c. The Rules Commission which shall advise the Bureau of the Conference on questions of procedure shall prepare the agenda from proposals to modify the statutes of the T.U.I. or of the Trades Conference.
- d. The Commissions necessary for the presentation and discussion of the reports in plenary session on questions carried in the order of the day.
- II. Each delegate participating in the Conference shall have the right to take part in all discussions in plenary sessions. A delegate may not intervene a second time in the discussion of a question until all other delegates who wish to speak on the question have had an opportunity to do so.

  III.Requests to intervene shall be addressed to the President in writing.

# REGULATION OF THE VOTE IN THE TRADES CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE VIII:

1. The vote in the Conference shall be given by raised hands. However, at the requests of two or more organizations, a vote can be made by roll call. In such a case, the vote will be made on the following basis:

up to 10,000 members . . . . . . . one vote

10,001 - 50,000 . . . . . . . . . . one vote for each additional block of 20,000 members (above the initial 10,000) or majority fraction thereof.

50,001 - 500,000 members . . . . . . one vote for each additional block of 50,000 members (above the first 50,000 counted as above) or majority fraction thereof.

above 500,000 members. . . . . . . . . one vote for each additional block of 100,000 members or majority fraction thereof.

2. The number of voices for the roll call vote is based on the total effective membership of each affiliated organization at the end of the year preceeding the meeting of the Trades Conference or of the Administrative Committee.

- 3. In the event that one or several affiliated organizations cannot, for justifiable reasons, participate directly in a conference, they can, with the approval of the Administrative Committee, delegate their right to vote to affiliated organizations of their choosing of other countries.
- 4. All of the decisions of the Conference are taken by majority vote or by a percentage fixed in advance by the Conference.

#### THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

#### ARTICLE IX:

- 1. The Administrative Committee shall direct the activities of the T.U.I. between sessions of the Trades Conference. It shall have the responsibility of applying effectively the decisions of the last Conference, and, in order to do so, it shall take the initiative in activities within its competence.
- 2. It shall be required to render an accounting of its activity to the Trades Conference and it shall be responsible for the activity of the T.U.I. before the Executive Committee of the WFTU.
- 3. It shall prepare and submit a report on its activities to the Conference.
- 4. It shall elect from among its own membership the Secretary of the  $T_{\bullet}U_{\bullet}I_{\bullet}$
- 5. It shall convene twice a year and oftener when necessary, after consulting the WFTU.
- 6. It shall convoke the Trades Conference at the date fixed by the preceding Conference. It sets its own order of the day. It fixes the location of its meeting. It duly informs the WFTU of its measures.
- 7. It sets up the annual budget of the T.U.I. in accordance with its funds and its activities program, submitting it to the WFTU. Upon approval of the proposed budget by the WFTU, the Administrative Committee makes all necessary administrative and technical arrangements for the implementation of the decisions of the Conference and of the plan of work adopted in accordance with the Statutes of the T.U.I. To that end, it shall designate or elect its own functionaries; it shall determine the salaries and appointments

of the secretaries and other personnel, and, where necessary, of technicians and specialists, in conformance with salary scales in force in the WFTU. The expenses of the delegations of the members of the Administrative Committee are chargeable to the T.U.I., on the basis of the same rules as those in force in the WFTU.

8. The Administrative Committee fixes the powers and responsibilities of the Secretary of the T.U.I. It sets up specific regulations to that effect.

#### FUNDS AND BUDGETS

#### OF THE TUI

#### ARTICLE X:

- 1. The T.U.I. roceives annually 25% of the assessments paid into the WFTU by the National Centrals (i.e., by the national maritime unions affiliated with the WFTU) during the preceeding fiscal year.
- 2. Trade unions affiliated directly with the T.U.I. must pay the T.U.I. an amount equal to that received by the T.U.I. from the WFTU per 1,000 members, namely: one Pound, plus the possible additional assessments provided for in Paragraph 5 of Article X of the Statutes of the T.U.I.
- 3. The amount due from the organizations cited in Paragraph 2 above is calculated on the total effective membership of each at the end of the year preceeding the Trades Conference.
- 4. Collections are paid half-yearly. Every organization in arrears by a year or more loses its right to participate effectively in the Trade Conference, except by special authorization to do so by the Administrative Committee.
- 5. If the Trades Conference finds that resources available through application of Paragraphs 1 4 above are not enough to cover expenditures of the T.U.I., the Administrative Committee may ask the Executive Bureau of the WFTU for advice about possible methods of getting additional funds.

The budget and activities program of the T.U.I. should be projected with such an eventuality in mind.

Upon approval by the Executive Committee of the WFTU, the T.U.I. may levy a special assessment, on condition that it is first approved by the Trades Conference and is then ratified by a two-thirds vote. Such a referendum shall be made by letter or telegram to all organizations of the T.U.I. Votes received after 90 days from the date of transmission of the letters or telegrams shall not be considered.

#### REPRESENTATION IN THE WFTU

ARTICLE XI: The T.U.I. is represented at the World Congress and in the General Council by one delegate and one substitute who have one vote in case of a roll call vote.

When the Executive Committee of the WFTU is considering a problem of interest to seamen, dockers, river workers, fishermen, or port workers, a representative of the T.U.I. shall be invited to the meeting in a consultative capacity.

ARTICLE XII: The three Auditors examine and certify the accounts of the T.U.I.

They submit their reports to the Administrative Committee and to the Trades

Conference.

#### DISCIPLINE

ARTICLE XIII: Any affiliated organization that violates, gravely and persistently, the Statutes of the T.U.I. or the regulations and decisions of the WFTU may be excluded from the T.U.I. on a two-thirds roll call vote of the Trades Conference upon the request of the Administrative Committee and of the WFTU.

ARTICLE XIV: Any conflict between the T.U.I. of seamen, dockers, river workers, fishermen, and port workers, and another T.U.I. is submitted to the Executive Bureau of the WFTU for final decision.


