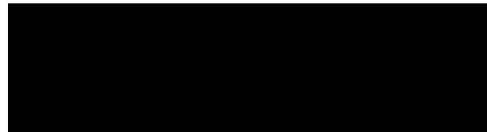
Per conversation with [REDACTED] of the Eastern Division of the Language and Area School, the new procedure for handling Lectures Series is as follows;

1. The following series of lectures is scheduled for spring. The series follows the general pattern of the Orientation Lecture Series on Russia. Each presentation will be followed by a fifteen-minute question-and-answer period.
