10 July to 16 July 1957REGULAR PROGRAMS

1. CIA Introduction: On 15 July this program was conducted for persons. 25X1
2. FSO Briefing: On 11 July this program was conducted for 65 persons. At the request of the Foreign Service Institute, the June and July classes had been combined for this one time.

OTHER LECTURES

1. A presentation on the history of American intelligence was delivered in the Intelligence Orientation Course on 15 July.
2. A two-hour lecture and discussion period on "CIA, the IAC, and the NSC Today" was given at the Strategic Intelligence School. The audience attending this two-week summer course put on by the SIS consists of reserve military intelligence personnel from all over the country. They constitute a high-caliber audience. Of the 125 members in attendance, some 20 per cent had Ph.D.'s, and another 20 per cent were lawyers. The question period was particularly stimulating.
3. On 12 July an informal lecture and discussion period lasting 3½ hours was conducted for the National Security Agency Senior Officers Course. It was the opening day of their three-month course and served as an orientation to intelligence and the national security structure. The briefing was somewhat different from other briefings usually given here in that it related special intelligence with other forms of intelligence. The chief instructor of the course indicated afterwards that this briefing should be a permanent part of the Senior Officers Course.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. On 11 July the OTR Orientation Officer attended a two-hour lecture on the mission and organization of the FBI at the Strategic Intelligence School.
