II. OTHER ACTIVITIES

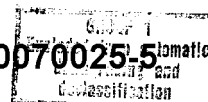
1. It was interesting to hear at the recent staff meeting that the Operations School is wrestling with the problem of introducing more "practical work" into its courses. We, also, have been seeking additional methods of emphasizing the practical side - consistent with the amount of factual information which has to be gotten across. Particularly with the JOT classes, we have been adding wherever possible exercises involving their projecting themselves into a Communist situation - in which current factors are analyzed from the CP viewpoint and a line of CP action has to be determined. We have consistently attempted to use this approach, but have now included more hours devoted to it. This has always been the most satisfactory method of pinpointing Communism as an action system - as DDTR has re-emphasized.

2. We have confirmed with [REDACTED] FE, that SIC will not participate in the upcoming China Familiarization Course, but will postpone its participation until the next course - due in the spring. There would have been a rather impractical overlap with the China week of our current JOT course.

3. A group of about twenty JOTs of the current class will be holding an informal seminar at my home on the evening of 24 February. This is at their request - in order to expand upon

4. We begin a special introductory course today for seven representatives of [REDACTED]. This is an abbreviated four-day version of the normal two-week Introduction to Communism.

5. I had a luncheon meeting last week with Messrs. Melbourne, Keppel, and Stutesman of the FSI. Keppel indicated that SIC would be asked at least one more time to provide a disproportionate share of lectures in the Communist Strategy course - in order to give him time to find adequate replacements. I believe that he is being perfectly honest in his efforts to find additional non-SIC participants. I will meet further with Stutesman to determine the extent of SIC's participation in the new Mid-Career course.

6. I spent a rather pleasant evening with [REDACTED] and his "inner circle" group of Republican Congressional Assistants on 9 February. There were about fifteen present, including [REDACTED] from our Legislative Counsel's office. The ostensible subject for discussion was the Sino-Soviet Rift, but the conversation ranged considerably further afield. Surprisingly - the session lasted for almost four hours.

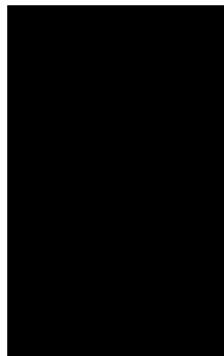
