1. Except for Monday, Agency personnel were in daily evidence in support of DIS courses.

2. Tuesday afternoon, [redacted] conducted post-conferences with IC/RC seminar participants in a surveillance exercise. It was agreed that those who engaged in the exercise did much better than the predecessor group of last summer. I attribute the noticeable improvement to the meaningful briefing given by [redacted]

3. [redacted] spoke to the Attaché class on Wednesday. [redacted] announced he will no longer do so, because of a change in assignment. Hereafter, [redacted] will likely replace [redacted] on KGB and GRU topics.

4. On Thursday, I picked up [redacted] for his three-hour presentation to the DIC on Observation and Sketching. The weather was foul so we resorted to an indoor alternative when it came time for the practical exercise. Dick had planned to obtain some models and other equipment while in D.C. for use [redacted] so we forded the downtown area for the purchases.

5. Because of Thursday's rains, half of the Naval Station Annex was without electric power for most of Friday. [redacted] spoke to the DIC class in the morning; we picked our way upstairs aided by Navy battle lamps. The class of DIC students asked many questions of Don on some registry and coordination procedures. One student proposed modifying the planned automation of source records so as to serve another purpose. [redacted] of the DIC faculty, felt the student's proposal went "too far"--as he and Don and I held an evaluation session afterwards. On the other hand, Don admitted that the student suggestion --impractical at present--would nonetheless be of real benefit to the community when automation became a reality.

6. Also on Friday, an Agency speaker covered Non-Technical Approaches for the Attaché class and wives of many of the students.

[redacted] was scheduled as the speaker, but he is on TDY in Europe.

His replacement [redacted] was a bit better than [redacted] would have been. Like [redacted] however, [redacted] advised Attachés to avoid "cultivation" by opposite numbers. This is contrary to what [redacted] tells them, as he encourages cultivation. I have asked [redacted] to coordinate this point with [redacted] so that the two speakers do not present a disunited front when the topics are repeated in early November with the DIC class. Conceivably, this issue may also come up in OTR classes.
