This means that the CTP will be in a very favorable position for selecting and filling the January 1972 class, as well as having an outstanding group for the July 1971 class.

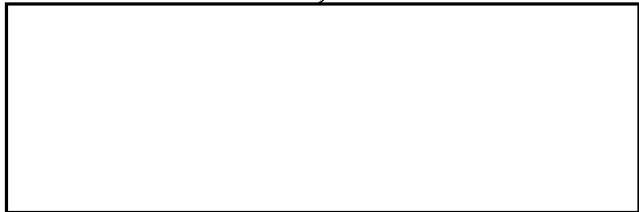

The retention rate (52% for the period January '64 - January '71 versus 79% for non-military during the same period) of military Career Trainees received another jolt this week when the last two active duty military officers remaining in the Program resigned just prior to conversion to civilian status.
