1. As is customary, a call was placed this morning to Dean Van Gorder, Assistant Dean, Administrative Director of Advanced Management Program of the Harvard Business School. This is designed to permit the Dean a little advance warning, prior to the written submissions, of the name and a little brief background on the Agency candidate. His greeting was warm and after a few pleasantries I told him that I was calling as usual to give him the normal preview of coming attractions.
