 TONS. THERE ARE A FEW BRIDGES WITH AS LOW A CAPACITY AS THREE

 (3) TONS AND ALSO SOME WITH A CAPACITY OF UP TO THIRTY (30) TONS.
- C. QUERIES REGARDING THE MAP SHOWING THE ROADS ACROSS THE NEPAL BORDER:
- 1. FROM TINGRI DZONG THERE IS A ROAD ENTERING THONG PASS;

 HOWEVER, IT COULD NOT BE OBSERVED THROUGH THE PASS TO ITS WESTERN Grace (File)

 TERMINUS.
- 2. THERE IS A MOTORABLE ROAD BETWEEN KHAMBA DZONG AND TINGKYE DZONG.
- 3. THE FIGURES MENTIONED AGAINST THE ROADS DENOTE THEIR SUSTAINED CAPACITY. IF BOTH THE RED AND BLACK NUMBERS ARE WITHIN THE SAME RANGE IT CAN BE ASSUMED THAT THERE IS NO DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THEM.
