SUBJECT : Data Collection Exercise at Ft. Knox, Kentucky

1. The National Photographic Interpretation Center (NPIC) is presently under contract with [ ] in an effort to establish what Essential Elements of Information can be obtained from [ ] Reconnaissance Imagery. This effort is part of a larger Intelligence Community effort; the primary participants being the United States Air Force (Rome Air Development Center) and the Central Intelligence Agency. The effort consists of conducting aerial overflights of specific facilities of National interest during a five-day period while ground truth teams are concurrently measuring certain parameters of the component parts which compose the facility.

2. Fort Knox, Kentucky, has been selected as a facility of National interest; therefore, it is requested that permission be obtained from the Commanding General, Ft. Knox, to make the necessary overflights and ground measurements required for fulfillment of the program objectives. Because of the special nature of this target, it is highly desirable that Mr. [ ] describe the contemplated operation and associated logistical problems with the appropriate Fort Knox personnel during the week of 16 November 1970. If approval is authorized, the Data Collection Program would be conducted from 30 November thru 4 December 1970.

3. A list of all personnel involved and their respective security clearances will be forwarded at a later date to the Fort Knox Security Officer. It is anticipated that approximately eight (8) individuals will be involved in this effort.

4. The exact facilities and equipment that will require ground measurement will be determined during the initial meeting between Mr. [ ] and the Fort Knox personnel. The teams will be making radiometric measurements and taking ground photographs of the facilities and equipments overflown. The points of contact within NPIC will be [ ] In their absence, [ ] will serve as the contact point.

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5. A reply to this request would be appreciated as soon as practical indicating when this operation can be undertaken.
