MEMORANDUM FOR:   
SUBJECT : Official Reprimand

1. This memorandum is an official reprimand to you, because of the results of your actions during off-duty hours while in attendance at the Defense Sensor Interpretation and Application Program, Offutt AFB, Omaha, Nebraska, from 5 January 1970 to 4 March 1970.

2. While enrolled in that Program, you pursued your hobby of free-lance commercial photography, displaying poor judgment in the contacts you made while doing so. This led to your arrest on 28 February 1970 in Sarpy County, Nebraska, which has caused embarrassment to the Agency, NPIC and the USAF 3428 Technical Training Squadron, and a considerable expenditure of time, effort and funds.

3. This situation was aggravated in my view by your inadequate performance in this course. As the senior member of the class, in terms of grade and Agency service, you were the designated NPIC course representative. It was expected that you would set a good example for the other NPIC students and be of assistance to your classmates. However, reports on your academic performance showed you to have been at the bottom of your class.

4. I advise you to divorce yourself from any photographic pursuits that could be of embarrassment to the Agency. In the future, you will be expected to conduct yourself, both on and off the job, in a manner which will reflect credit on yourself. We cannot tolerate further incidents. If any should occur, it would result in a recommendation for more severe action including possible removal from the IP Career Service.

5. This memorandum will be made a permanent part of your Official Personnel Folder.
