[Redacted] said that Mike Joy, of the Senate Budget Committee, made the request on behalf of Senator Ernest Hollings (D., S. C.). I told [Redacted] there seemed to be some discrepancy between what the Committee members wanted and what the staff members were requesting. As soon as this problem was cleared up. I told [Redacted] I would be back in touch.

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27. [Redacted] Spoke with Grace Murphy, Representative Ralph Regula's (R., Ohio) office, about the students Mr. Regula would like to have visit the Agency. There will be about 200 people, students and chaperones, who would like to come out on 2 April. She asked if we could arrange the lecture as early as possible in the morning. I told her I would be back in touch.

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31. [REDACTED] LIAISON Representative Samuel S. Stratton (D., N. Y.) called and said he would like to get some idea of the sensitivity of the leaks of the Pike Report. I told Mr. Stratton that we would get someone familiar with the items in the report up tomorrow to talk with him about it. I also mentioned that Mr. Bush, during his appearance on the "Meet the Press" program on 22 February, had addressed himself to this subject and offered to provide Mr. Stratton with a copy of the transcript of that program.

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33. [REDACTED] LIAISON Called Jerry Christison, in the office of Senator Claiborne Pell (D., R. I.), to arrange an appointment for Mr. Carver, NIO, and Mr. Cary to meet with him to discuss project [REDACTED]. 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34. [REDACTED] LIAISON Called Margie Nicholson, Executive Secretary to Chairman John McClellan, Senate Appropriations Committee, and advised her that the Director would like to meet with Chairman McClellan tomorrow or Friday. She advised that the Senator is out of town and will not return until late tomorrow, but could see the Director at 9:00 on Friday. After checking with the Director's office, I told Ms. Nicholson that time would be fine with the Director.

25X1 1. [REDACTED] LIAISON I met with Bill Hogan, House Armed Services Committee staff, and secured from him the Office of Security file on Lee Pennington, which had been given to Chairman Lucien Nedzi (D., Mich.), Special Subcommittee on Intelligence, House Armed Services Committee, during the Subcommittee's Watergate investigation. I told Hogan that Mr. Madigan, Senator Howard Baker's (R., Tenn) staff man, on the Senate Select Committee, had requested the file for review.

I also informed Hogan that the Agency will hold a seminar on 8 and 9 March on Machine Translation Devices to which Mr. Peter Toma, President of the LATSEC COMPANY, will be invited. Hogan will pass this on to Representative Bob Wilson (R., Calif.), who has been following Toma's negotiations with the Agency. I asked Hogan as to when the Subcommittee plans to schedule hearings on the Agency's bill H. R. 11088, to amend CIARDS. Hogan said that due to other pressing business, he could not give me a firm date. However, he felt certain that action would be taken in this Congress.

25X1 3. [REDACTED] FOIA I met with Mr. Jerry Springarn, Staff Director to Representative Henry S. Reuss (D., Wisc.), and explained the delay in the handling of the FOIA request from Mr. David Novick by the Agency's Information and Privacy Coordinator. I left with him correspondence from the Coordinator to Novick and Representative Reuss. Springarn was appreciative of the visit and said the delay would cause no problem.

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9. [] LIAISON Tom Dine, Senate Budget Committee staff, called to request a compartmented clearance for himself. He explained that the Committee had determined that there should be a review of the intelligence budget which Senators Alan Cranston (D., Calif.) and Pete V. Domenici (R., N. Mex.) were to head up and Dine would be the principal staff man. In response to my query, he explained that he intended to obtain the budget material from Bill Bader, Senate Select Committee staff, who had informed him that compartmented clearances were a prerequisite. Dine wanted me to get back in touch with him on this by Monday and I said we would look into it.

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11. [] LEGISLATION Tom Smeeton, of Representative William Broomfield's (R., Mich.) office, called to discuss various aspects of the sources and methods legislation which the Congressman co-sponsored, and to get my reaction to some statements made by Broomfield in the Congressional Record.

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12. [] LEGISLATION Attended the second mark-up session of the Senate Government Operations Committee on the oversight issue. (See Memorandum for the Record.)

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13. [] LIAISON Pat Holt, Chief of Staff, Senate Foreign Relations Committee, called and said since the transcript of 18 February 1976 as edited is only Confidential, he wants three copies made and all of them to go to him. I said that was fine with us since Holt agreed that I would review a copy to confirm the Confidential classification.

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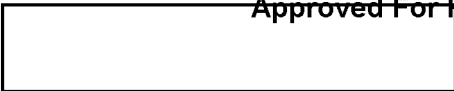

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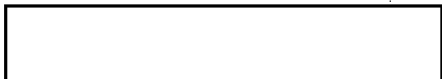

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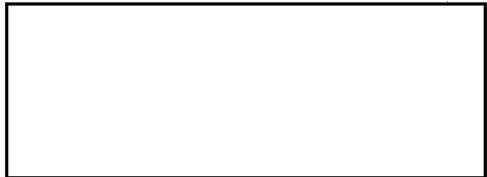
