Mr. Kreer and Mr. Barringer presented the State De-25X1 partment's requirements. There was no opposition to consideration of the subject. Comm. Webster pointed out some of the difficulties involved in regulating and policing stations in embassies of foreign countries, but was assured by Mr. Barringer that any agreements entered into would spell out, specifically, the terms and types of operation agreed on, and that the State Department could police such agreements. To Comm. Webster's specific question to the State Department as to whether the operation of a diplomatic network and the granting of reciprocal radio rights to foreign nations for the purpose of strengthening the network was in the nation's interest, Mr. Barringer said that State felt that the operation of such a network and the granting of reciprocal rights were truely in the national interests of the United States of America. Comm.
