REQUIREMENT HTA/SI/S16/57: Give a general description of Vladivostok Shipyard No. 202 and classify by type the ships present at the shipyard.

REMARKS:

An examination [REDACTED] photography covering the Vladivostok Naval Base and Shipyard 202 reveals that facilities include three graving docks, 760 by 120 feet, 640 by 100 feet, and 570 by 120 feet. Located adjacent to the graving docks are forge and machine shops, foundries, plate shops, power and pump houses, electronic and ordnance shops, warehouses, and other buildings typical of a major shipyard.

This naval base and shipyard is accurately described in detail in the ONI Vladivostok Port Intelligence Study referenced above, except for the following changes:

1. The barracks-type building located just north of building No. 22 has been replaced by a T-shaped building 200 by 160 feet over-all. A large smokestack has been constructed adjacent to this new building, indicating that it may function as a power and/or steam plant.

2. A modified C-shaped building, 220 by 40 feet, has been constructed 200 feet due west of the new T-shaped building.
3. Three wings, each 140 by 40 feet, have been added to the building located just north of building No. 20.
