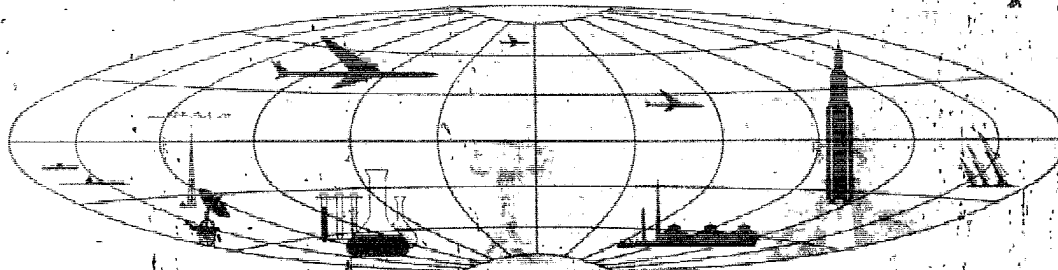

A study of the aircraft at Omsk East Airfield, the fly-away field for Omsk Airframe Plant 166,

These swept-wing aircraft appear to be of two sizes, although this may be an effect caused by the different surfaces and tone of the aprons on which they are parked. An attempt to measure the aircraft and the angle of sweep of the wings did not succeed because of the inability to define clearly the outlines of the aircraft and thus insure that the dimensions obtained were actually those of the objects being measured. A gross size comparison of the unidentified aircraft with the probable CAB and CUB/CAT results in an estimated length of 40 to 50 feet and wing span of 25 to 35 feet.

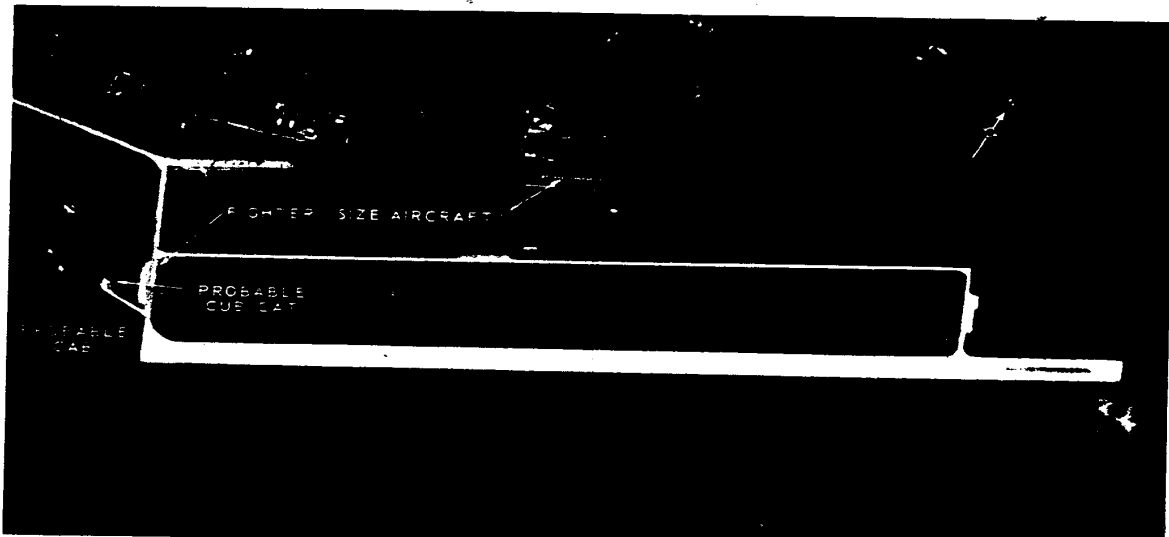


FIGURE 1. OMSK EAST AIRFIELD [REDACTED]
