

PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and Logistic installations being prepared for a DLV CLV Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CLA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1c (DLA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the Production Center 1P1c.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training areas or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF SHEPETOVKA ARMY BARRACKS SOUTHEAST, USSR.

SUMMARY

Shepetovka Army Barracks Southeast, a road- and rail-served secured military installation covering approximately 200 acres, is situated on the southeast side of Shepetovka (Figure 1).




FIGURE 3. SHEPETOVKA ARMY BARRACKS SOUTHEAST. Sketch compiled from

The installation (Figures 2 and 3) contains 11 probable barracks, six multistory barracks, two L-shaped multistory barracks, 13 administrative buildings, three multistory administrative buildings, one multistory theater/gymnasium-type building, seven vehicle storage

 buildings, three vehicle maintenance/storage buildings with attached sheds, 41 storage buildings, and one guard tower, and seven dependent housing quarters.

Training facilities consist of a pers 25 × 1D exercise track and a small arms firing range. The installation was observed on KEYHOLE missions between and appears active. Relatively little change was noted between

Other Buildings

Area H contains seven dependent 25 X 4 Dr quarters.

Equipment Storage/Maintenance Area

Area J contains two 325- by 35-foot vehicle storage buildings, two 420- by 50-foot vehicle storage buildings, three 240- by 45-foot vehicle storage buildings, three 160- by 75-foot vehicle maintenance/storage buildings with 90- by 45-foot shed attachment, three administrative buildings, and 10 storage buildings.

Athletic Field

Area K is an athletic field.

Small Arms Firing Range

Area L is a 620- by 40-foot small arms firing range. It cannot be ascertained whether the range is currently in use.

Railroad Service
A single-track rail spur leads into the installation. No railside docks are discernible.

Road Service

Roads leading to the installation are metalled, but the roads within the installation appear to be unimproved dirt roads.

Administrative and Troop Housing Areas

Area DI contains two E-shaped multistory barracks, two multistory administrative buildings, one administrative building, one theater/gymnasium-type building, and one guard tower.

Area D2 contains six multistory barracks, 11 probable barracks, one multistory administrative building, six administrative buildings and six storage buildings.

General Storage Area

Area E contains four administrative and 25 general storage buildings.
