SUMMARY

- . HYDRO ELECTRIC POWER PLANT located three miles south of Kutien, with a transmission line to Poochowsons
- . RAILROAD SURVEY noted on Min River for Nan Ping Foochow rail line area
- . TOKEN RADAR located near Foochorenee
- . NEW TYPE BEAM APPROACH LANDING SYSTEM indicated at Lien-Cheng Airfield on co

This memorandum reports the significant changes in the Southeast China 25X1D area as observed from a study of serial photography flown between 25X1D Items of specific interest include airfields, electronics, transportation and power sites.

Airfields 25X1D

Lien-cheng (25/40N - 116/40E): Photography dated indicated the electronic landing aid system to be a different type construction than that which has appeared at the other newly constructed fields in the Southeast China area. The outer beacon sits is located 12,000 feet from the south end of the runway. This site consists of a hard-surfaced circle approximately 100 feet in diameter which is connected to the airfield by a first class road. The inner beacon site consists of a hard-surfaced circle seventy feet in diameter served by a first class road which connects with the airfield. Both the inner and outer sites are in a direct line with the runway. The hard surfaced circles may indicate the future use of mobile electronic equipment as a navigational of aid at this airfield.

Lung-tien (25/35N - 119/28E): Surfacing in a "checker board" pattern continues on the runway, taxiways and hardstands. There is now a total of thirty revelments on the north side of the airfield. Frevious to the revamping of the airfield there were twenty revelments.

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Nan-tai (26/00N - 119/28E): No significant changes in the airfield or its facilities were noted.

<u>Ma-chaing (24/40N - 118/17E)</u>: A small POL storage area is under construction on the northwest corner of the airfield. The runway appears serviceable but no grading or resurfacing has recently been done.

Electronic Site

<u>Fu-chou:</u> A token radar installation has been located 6.6 miles southeast of Fu-chou. The site is in a cleared area on a hillside with an elevation of about 540 meters. A first class road serves the site connecting with the Fu-chow-Ma-25X1D Wei road. On same date three heavy trucks and one trailer were also at the gite. Located 1.4 mile south of the radar site is a four gun heavy anti-aircraft battery.

Kutien (26/36N - 118/48E): Located 2.8 miles south of Kutien and on the Kutien Chi (River) is a small dam. A power plant is located approximately

A jower line leads from the power plint south along the east tank of the Kutien Chi. The poles along this section are single poles carrying probably two wires. At Shui-kou, on the Hin River the power line turns east and runs to Fu-chou. This line follows the north bank of the Min and the wires are mounted on double poles. (See enclosure)

Transportation

25X1D Railroad: Photography dated revealed preliminary railroad survey lines along the north bank of the Min River from San-tu-kou (26/254 -118/33) to Heiang-chi-kou (26/14N - 118/55E). This is the first photographic evidence of work on the Nan-ping-Fu-chou railroad. The route of this line will probably be along the north bank of the Min River from Nan-ping to Fu-chou. (See enclosure 1).

Shipping: Activity at Ma-Wei (25/59N - 119/26E) continued during the period 25X1D covered by this report. On there were five cargo ships anchored off shore. These included two 100° long traft, two measuring 115° long and 25X1D one ship 360°. Photography dated revealed the presence of one of

noted at Kuan-tou (26/08N - 119/34E).

25X1D <u>Truck activity</u>: On photo coverage 221 trucks were counted in the vicintity of Chien-ou (27/03N - 118/19E). Sisteen of these trucks were seen in a convoy approaching Chien-ou on the road from Nan-ping, to the south.

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
