SUBJECT: Medical support for three main areas in the event of an atomic disaster

1. A series of five peripheral collecting points on the periphery of Washington, each of which is staffed by five-man teams of technicians, specifically trained in the management of radiation equipment is recommended. Two of these technicians will work out of each of these areas in a station wagon which is equipped with space to transport at least two patients, a voice commo apparatus and the following medical support equipment:
