
Official Diary (Acting DD/I)

Friday, 12 December 1952

- 1. At morning meeting, mentioned the cable indicating Mossadeq was renegotiating the 1921 treaty with Russia.
- 2. DCI brought up the vacuity of O/SI memorandum on flying saucers and

	evidence, that he was en route to ATIC at wright Field and therefore recommended to DCI that he not brief the President on this subject this morning. He concurred.
