The CRE Ad Noc Committee for Coordination of the D/FE Production Plan, as a result of its meeting of 28 December 1949, makes recommendations to the Estimates Production Board as follows:

- a. That coordination of the D/FE plan should proceed in two phases:
 - (1) Bilaterally between D/FE and each of the following divisions: D/NE, D/EE, D/NE, D/No, D/Ec, D/Tr and D/In.

- (2) Multilaterally by a committee composed of representatives of the foregoing divisions plus D/Pub and D/G1. The multilateral phase is intended to clarify any issues cutstanding at the termination of the bilateral phase.
- b. That personnel to engage in coordination should be appointed by division chiefs from at least the intelligence control level of the divisions concerned.
