

A considerable part of the first six weeks of the period covered by this report was devoted to discussions of the work of the newly created staff with various parts of State and CIA. 

B. Bibliography Service

An arrangement has been worked out, also with IR. State, for preparing bibliographies, including reports and dispatches from the field insofar as consistent with security, on special subjects for research workers engaged in projects of interest to the intelligence agencies. These are prepared as the situation arises and the materials made available on inter-library loan. This is the only way scholars can receive much of this material and has proved to be of valuable service.

12. Difficulties Requiring Action

They all desire, however, to have lists of basic research jobs that need to be done.
