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A CHRONOLOGY OF SIGNIFICANT INTERNATIONAL TERRORIST ACTS

1 March 1973	Khartoum, Sudan	Eight Black September Organization terrorists seized the Saudi Arabian Embassy as guests were departing from a reception. They held the new U.S. Ambassador to the Sudan and the departing Deputy Chief of Mission, the Belgian Charge, a Jordanian Charge and the Saudi Arabian Ambassador as hostages. The U.S. Ambassador, the Deputy Chief of Mission and the Belgian Charge were assassinated the following day. (See separate article.) (UNCLASSIFIED)
1 March 1973	Oslo, Norway	Norwegian police informed the duty officer at the U.S. Embassy that they had just received a telephone call stating that a bomb was set to explode at 0415 hours in the chancery. An immediate search of the interior of the chancery by the guards and

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an exterior search by police failed to reveal a bomb, and there was no explosion. (UNCLASSIFIED)

1 March 1973

Rawalpindi, Pakistan

Students set fire to the British Council Library following the return of the bodies of two Pakistani youths shot to death by police during a raid on the Indian High Commission in London. More than 1,000 students paraded through the streets with the coffins, shouting, "Down with British dogs." (UNCLASSIFIED)

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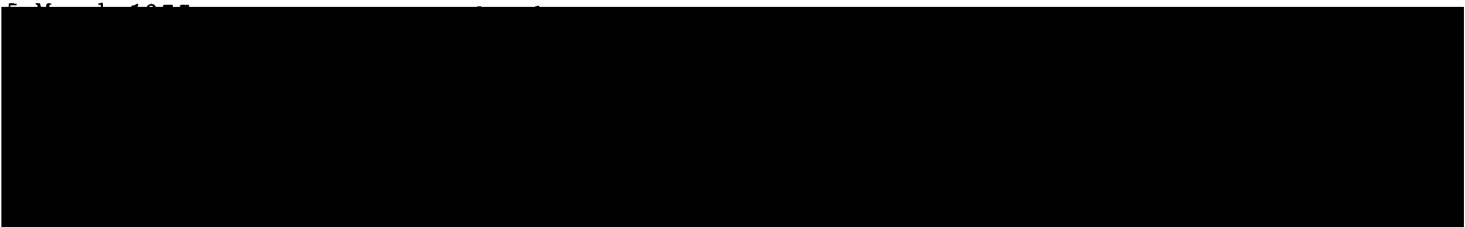
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4 March 1973

Beirut, Lebanon

The Greek charter ship "Sounion," carrying 250 American tourists bound for Haifa, Israel, sank in Beirut harbor following an explosion on board. There were no casualties, but two passengers were temporarily hospitalized from smoke inhalation. The Captain and crew members thought the explosion could have been caused by a bomb planted on the outside of the ship. However, a spokesman for the New York travel agency said it was caused by a faulty boiler. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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
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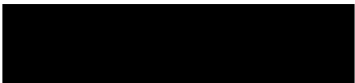

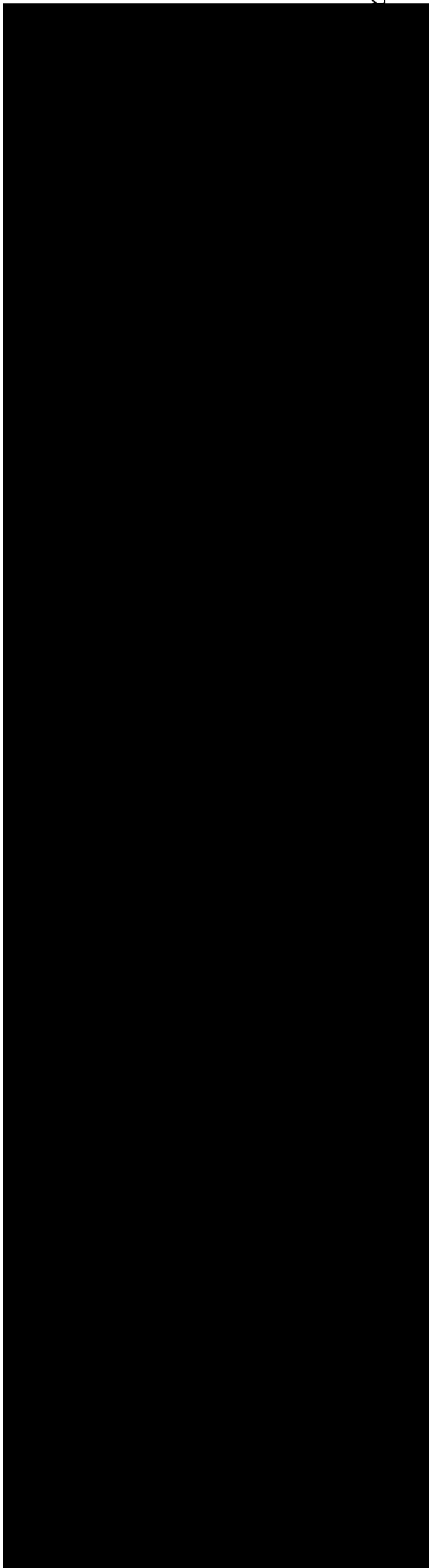
There were three attempted bombings in the vicinity of Israeli facilities. Plastic explosive charges were found by police in three cars, one of which had been parked near each of the following sites: First Israeli Bank and Trust Co.; Israeli Discount Bank; and the El Al warehouse facility at JFK International Airport. (See separate article.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

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8 March 1973

London, England

Several bombs were detonated in the immediate vicinity of British Government central offices, one near Old Bailey Central Criminal Court and one at Richmond Terrace. A third bomb was found unexploded outside New Scotland Yard police headquarters. U.K. officials believed the bombs were planted by the IRA in connection with the referendum on "future relations" of Northern Ireland with the U.K. (UNCLASSIFIED)

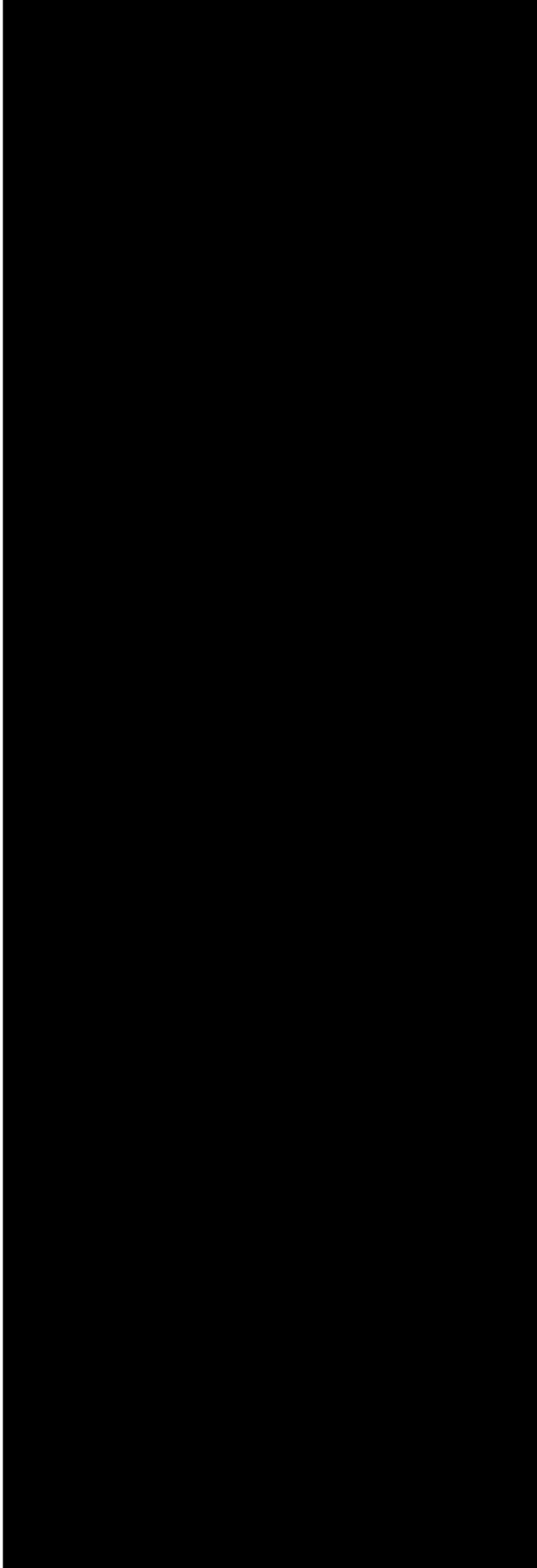
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American Express offices were evacuated after an anonymous telephone caller warned that the office would be blown up in five minutes. No bomb was found in the ensuing police search. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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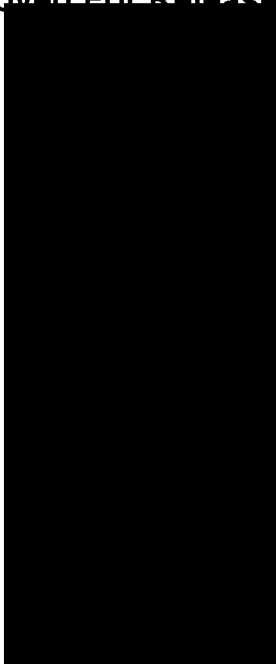

Germany

At approximately 2230 hours, a man and a woman entered the grounds of the U.S. Consulate General. One of them then fired a pistol shot at one of the plate glass windows and the other hurled a bottle against the same window. The couple were seen immediately afterwards fleeing the parking lot and entering a black Mercedes containing at least two other persons. The attack may have been part of a general protest by local radicals, since police reported a number of windows were broken at the Greek Central Bank and several

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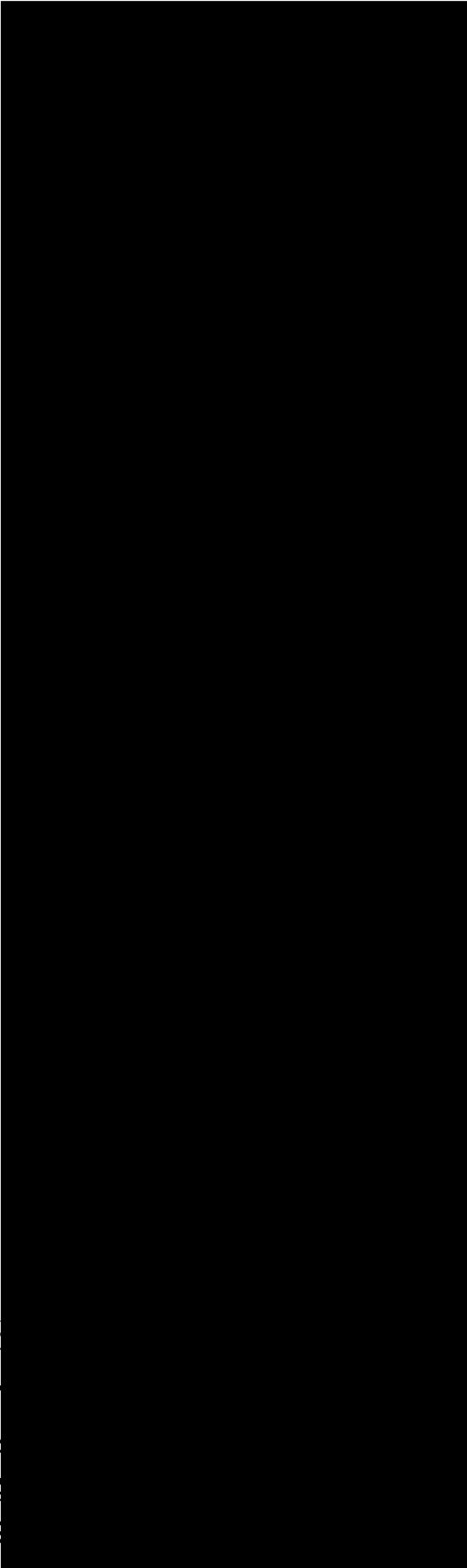
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travel agencies in the downtown area during the night. Police further reported finding a quantity of Molotov cock-tails on the roof of a garage near the Consulate General. Police are investigating and have arrested two suspects. (UNCLASSIFIED)

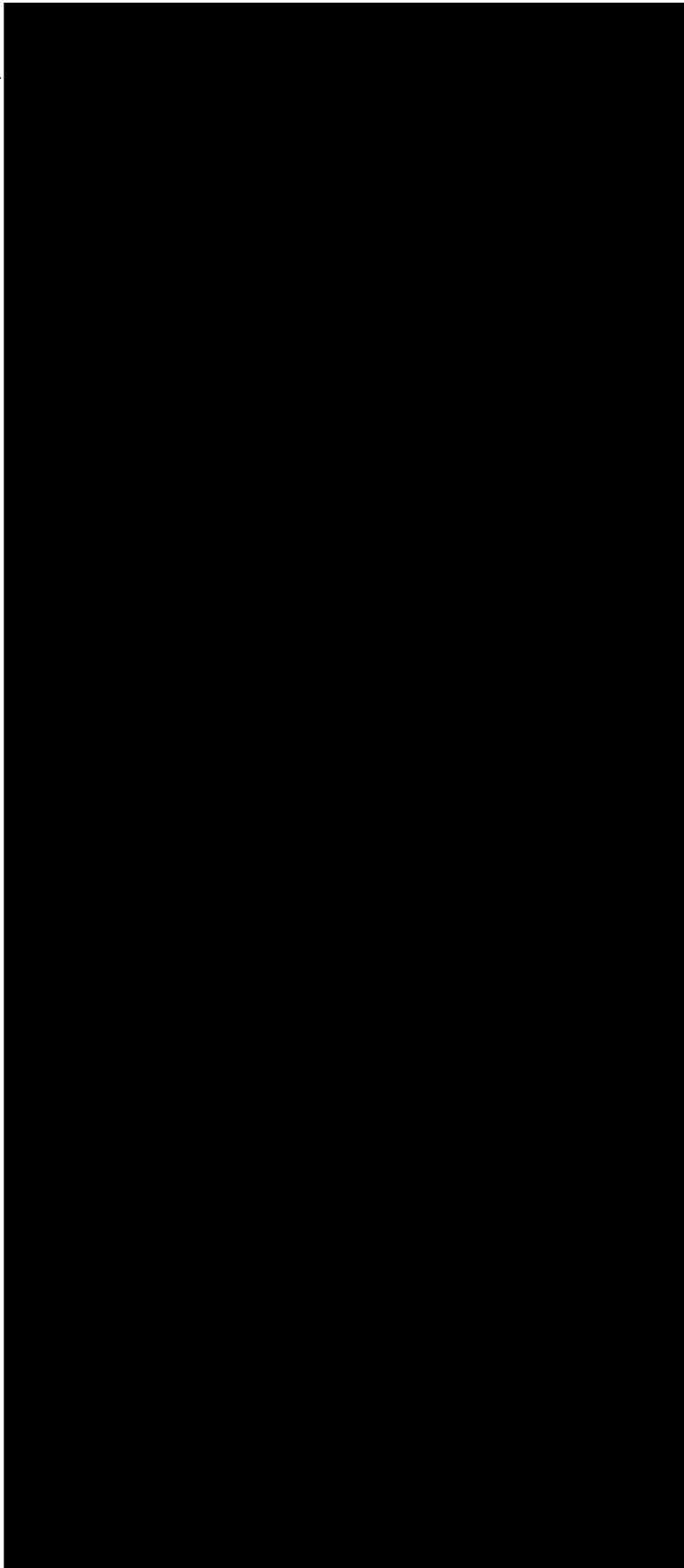

pal office building, the

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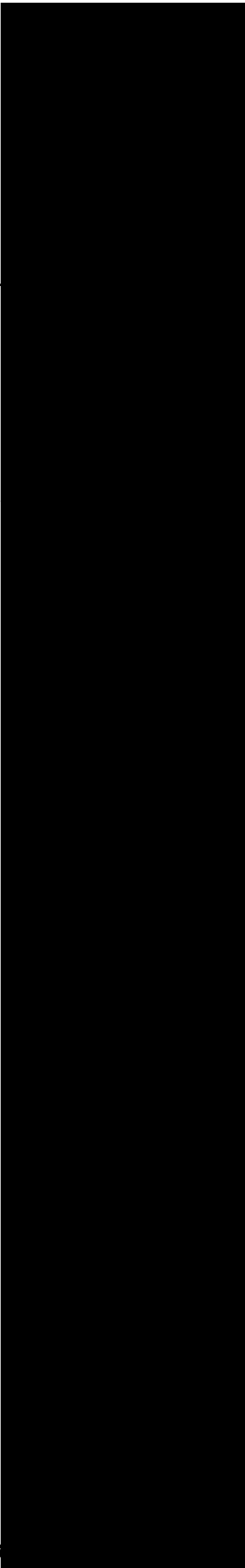
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school district office and the local court in Oujda, causing slight damage but no injuries. Two other explosions were reported in Nador. The bombings followed reports that subversive elements from Libya had infiltrated into Morocco. However, the Moroccan Interior Ministry said that the arrest of an unspecified number of leftist lawyers had led to the seizure of arms, ammunition and explosives. (Comment: It is not known if the explosion of the bombs and the arrest of the leftist lawyers have any relation.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

Jewish Synagogues	Los Angeles, California	Unknown	An unidentified individual telephoned the Israeli Consulate on 3 March 1973 and offered to supply a list of names and addresses of BSO members who are planning attacks on three places of worship, one being the Sinai

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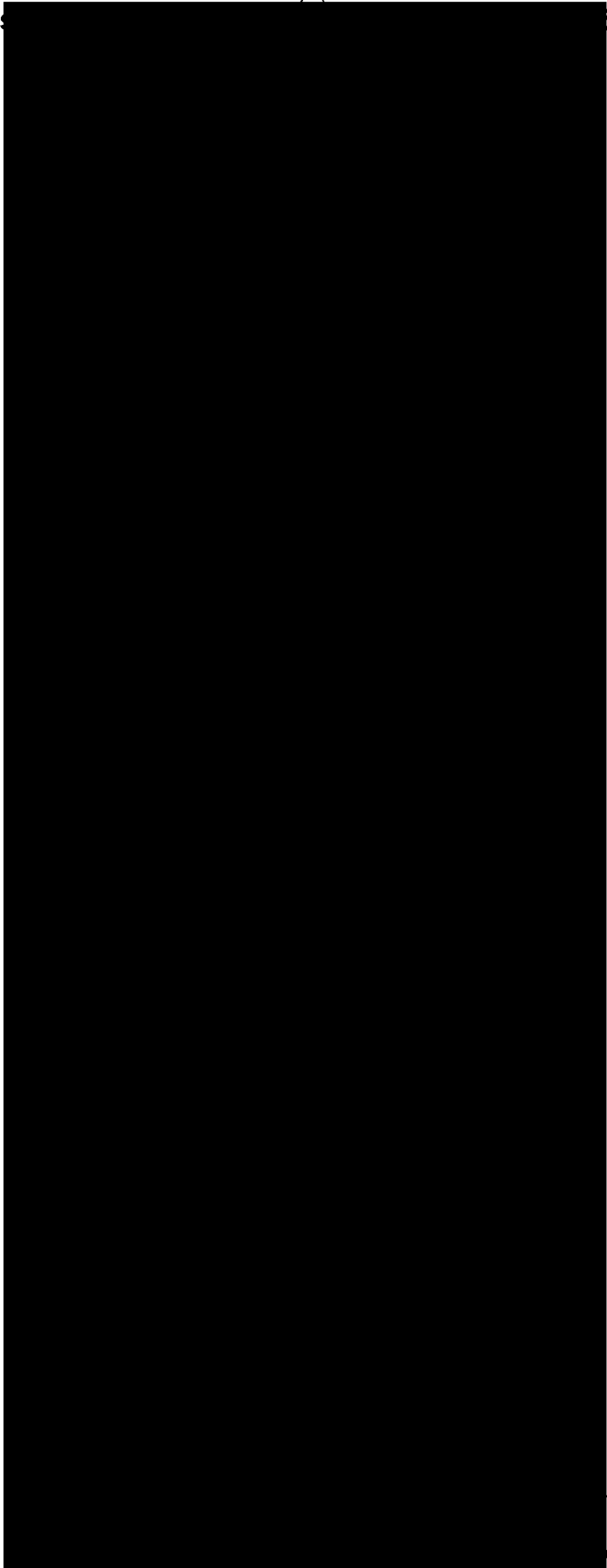
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Temple. The Los Angeles Police Department has placed the Sinai Temple under surveillance. (UNCLASSIFIED)

According to the 26 March 1973 press, French agents watching departures of the ferries from the English Channel port of Calais were tripled following a warning that an attempt may be made to hijack a cross-channel ferry or hover-craft. British and French authorities have intensified security precautions following reports that BSO terrorists were planning to strike during Sudanese President Numayri's late March visit to London. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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Investigation of Attempted Bombing of Israeli Installations in New York City

On 15 March 1973 the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) issued a warrant for the arrest of Khalid Dahham Al-Jawari for planting the bomb found near the El Al warehouse facility in Queens in New York City on 6 March 1973. Al-Jawari, who was described as a well-dressed, highly educated man, is an Iraqi citizen, and entered the United States on 12 January 1973, just five days after the itinerary for Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir's visit to the United States was announced from Jerusalem. (See the 14 March 1973 issue of the Weekly Situation Report on International Terrorism for further details on the three bombs found in New York City.)

Al-Jawari departed his room in the Mayflower Hotel in Jersey City on 4 March, and left behind a number of latent fingerprints plus some leftover plastic explosives and two batteries. According to the FBI, fingerprints found in the car containing the explosives at Kennedy Airport were identical with those found in Al-Jawari's room at the Mayflower. Along with the explosives, literature referring to the Black September Organization (BSO) also was found in the car.

FBI investigations have revealed that Al-Jawari, who was allegedly working with the BSO, has fled the United States. Attempts to locate him abroad are continuing.

A further study of the bombs used by the terrorists has revealed that they were set to explode at noon on 4 March 1973, which coincided with the arrival of Golda Meir in New

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York. A test detonation of one of the bombs produced a fireball approximately 25 feet in diameter, which rose to a height of 50 to 75 feet. Experts state that if the bombs had exploded in the trunks of the cars, the magnitude of the explosion would have been much greater. They further stated that anyone within 100 yards of the blast would have been fatally injured. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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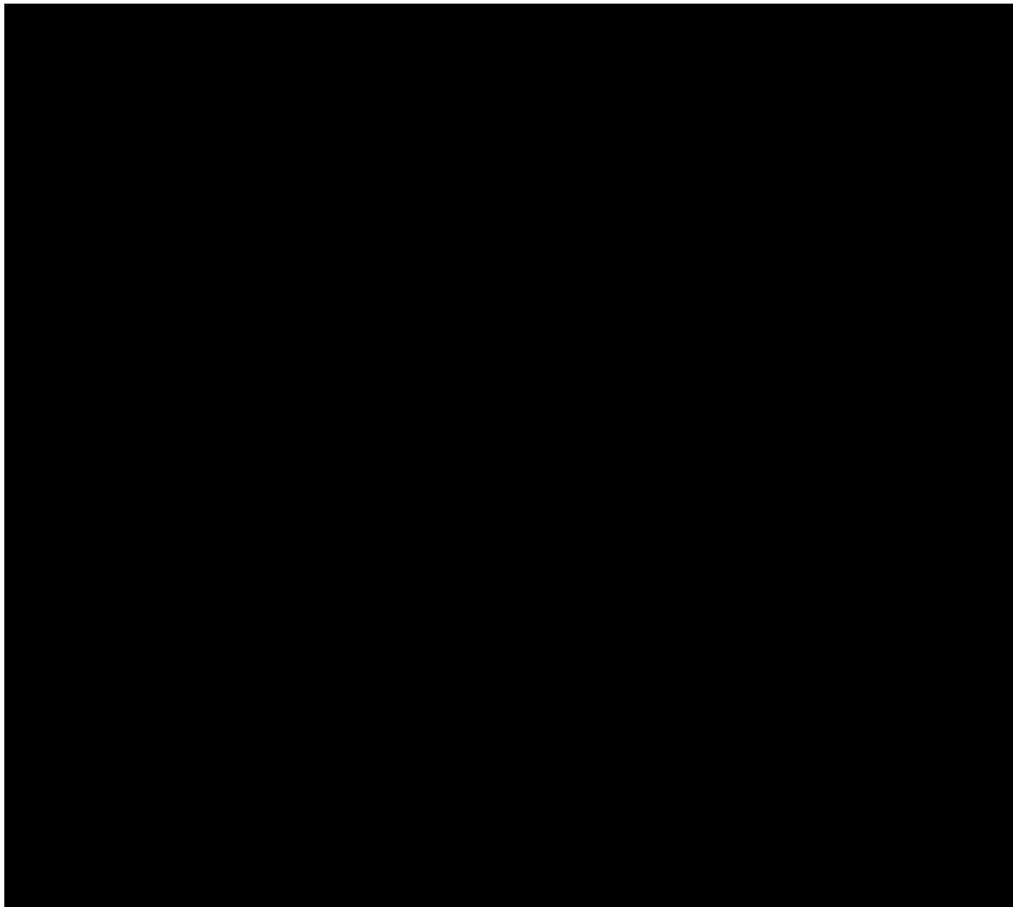
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Two Suspect Arab Terrorists Arrested in Northern Italy

Two Jordanians, described as former members of the Palestine Liberation Organization, were arrested 14 March in Como, a resort town north of Milan. One of them left a suitcase at Milan's main railway station which reportedly contained detailed pictures of Milan airport, the El Al office in Milan, and the main Milan rail station itself. The car in which they were arrested is said to have been stolen and they have been charged with the theft. The Italian press has linked the men with the Black September Organization, but there is as yet no confirmation of this. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Italian Police stepped up already strict security precautions at Fiumicino Airport after the discovery of a small arsenal of light machine guns, bombs and ammunition in four suitcases that had been left behind by unidentified persons. One of the cases also contained clippings from a Lebanese newspaper referring to Israeli attacks on Palestinian refugee camps. (See Notes) (UNCLASSIFIED)

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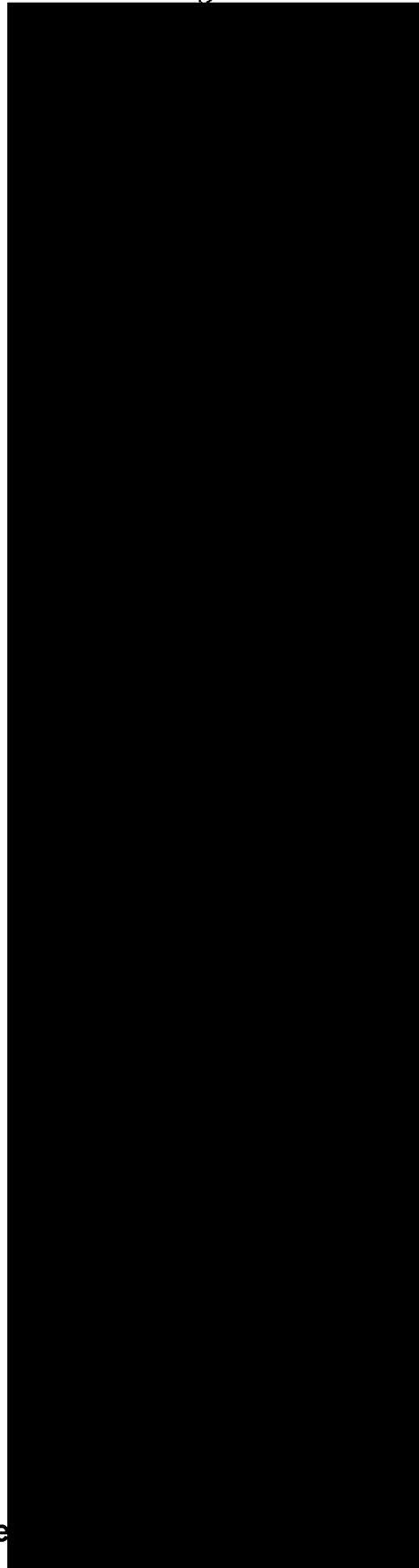
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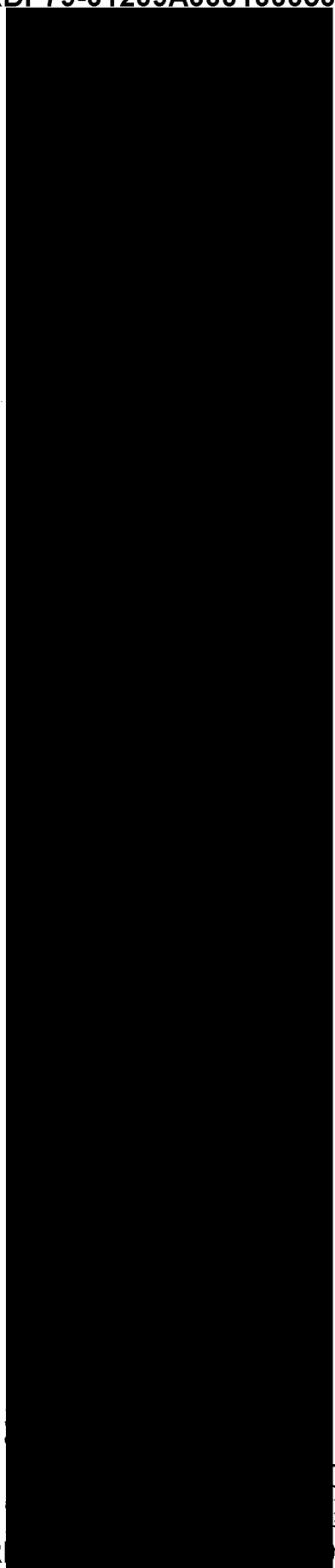
