British Businessman Released by Argentine Kidnappers

Charles Agnew Lockwood, the British businessman who was kidnapped in Buenos Aires on 6 June, was released on 29 July after the financial firm Roberts and Company, of which Lockwood is board chairman, agreed to pay the two million dollars demanded by the kidnappers. Over the past month different factions of the Trotskyist People's Revolutionary Army (ERP) have alternately claimed and denied responsibility for the kidnapping. According to a Reuter report, informed sources in Argentina said negotiations over Lockwood's release were delayed because he had been kidnapped from his original abductors by a rival faction of the ERP. Bandera Roja Leader Captured by Venezuelan Authorities

The leader of the urban guerrilla group Bandera Roja (BR), Carlos Betancourt, and a fellow member were captured by Venezuelan security agents in Caracas on 29 July. Two BR print shops were also uncovered. In the opinion of a senior security official, the arrests mean extinction for the BR. (See 20 June issue, page 8, for previous reporting on the Bandera Roja.) 21 July 1973	Lillehammer, Norway	Ahmed Bouchiki, a Moroccan citizen, was assassinated by unidentified assailants believed to be members of an Israeli counter-terror group. Norwegian authorities are conducting an investigation. (See separate article.) (UNCLASSIFIED)
24 July 1973	New York City	An explosion injured a maintenance worker and damaged the top floor of the Times Square office building where a pro-Castro Cuban exposition was being planned. Police authorities stated that the bombing was an effort by Cuban refugees to scare off supporters of the Cuban regime. (UNCLASSIFIED)
25 July 1973	Santiago, Chile	The offices of the Czech Embassy were seriously damaged by the explosion of a device which had been placed on the 14th floor of the building in which the offices are located. The Chilean authorities are investigating the explosion. (UNCLASSIFIED)

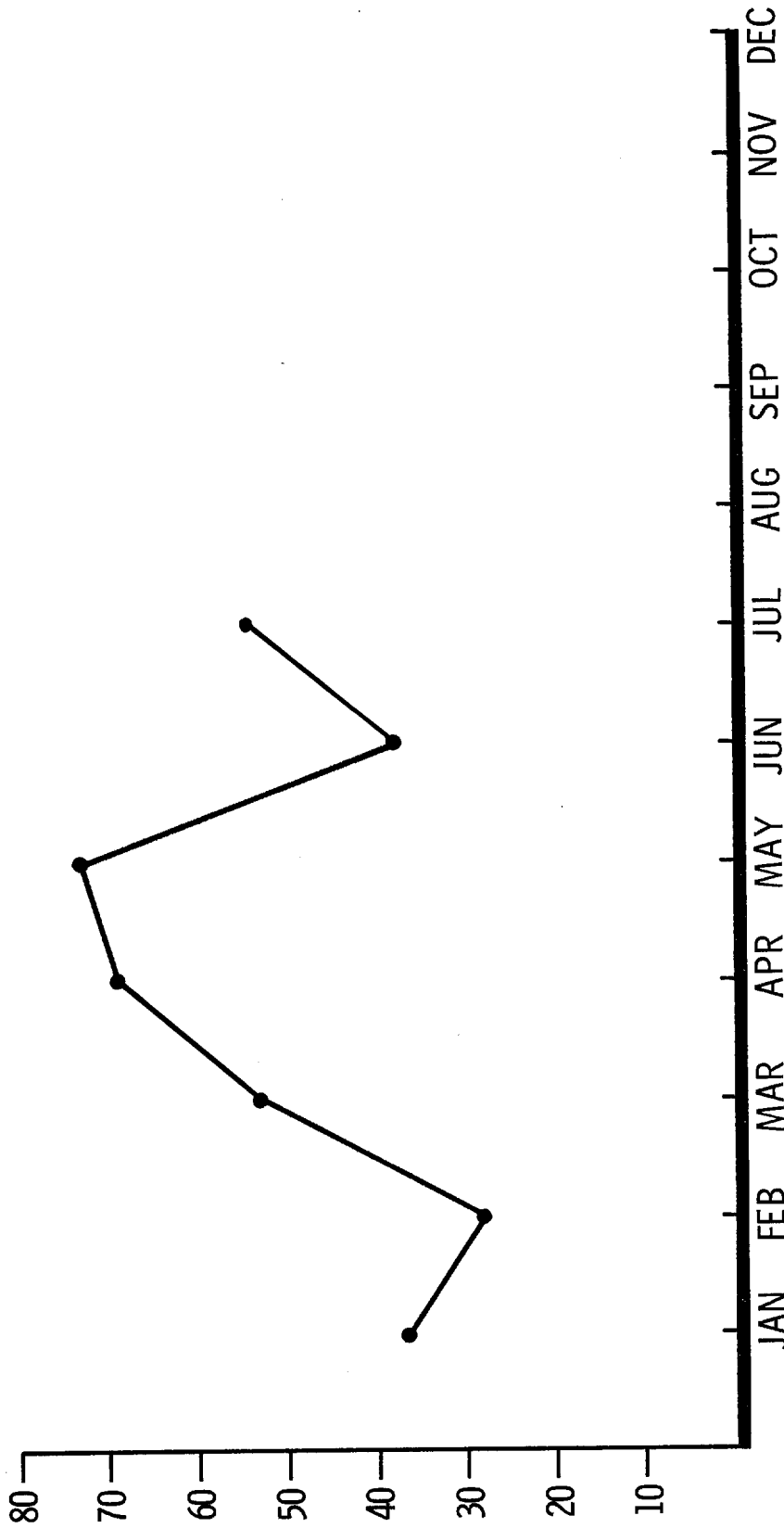

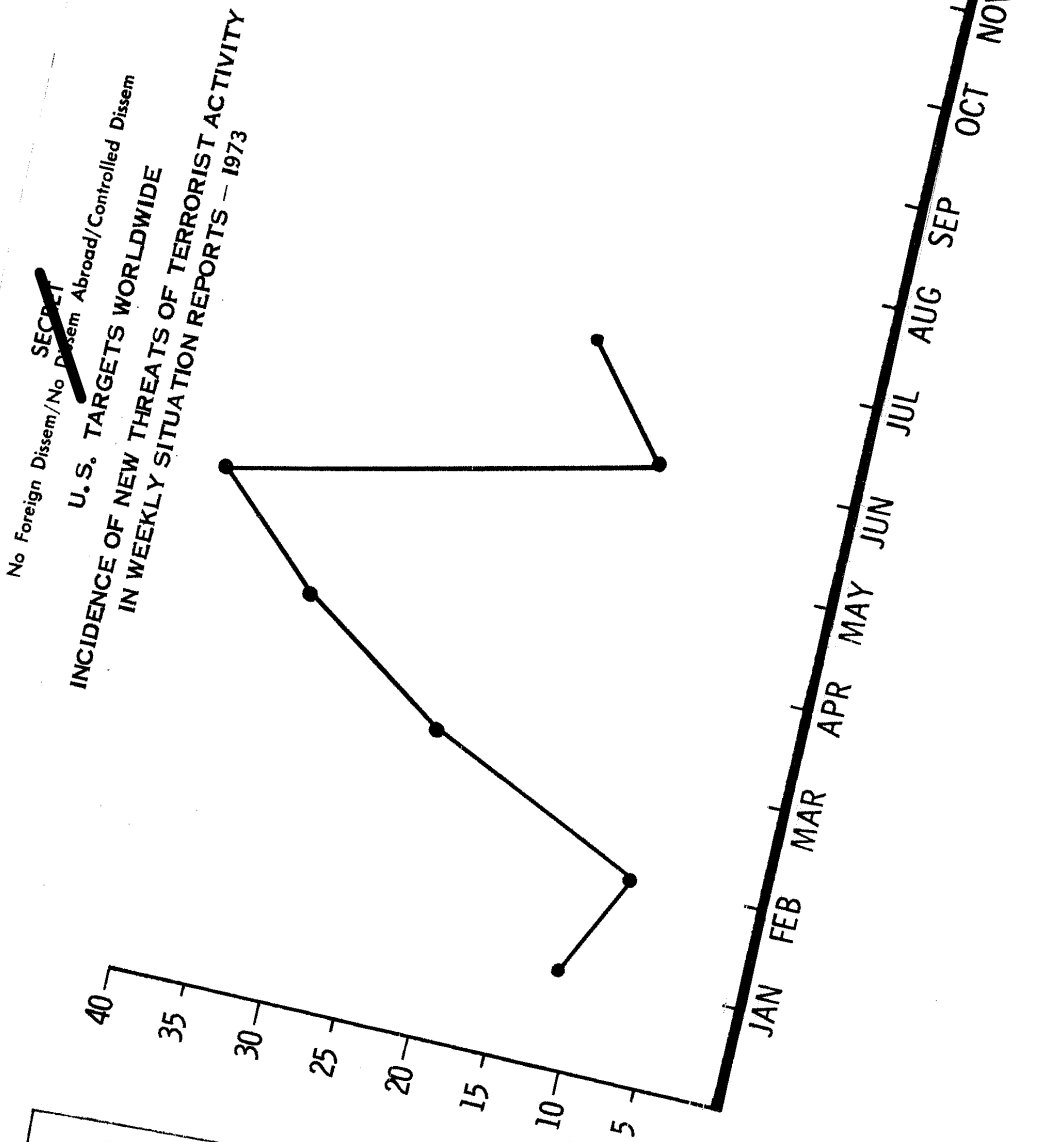
INCIDENCE OF NEW THREATS OF TERRORIST ACTIVITY

Coca Cola Company Orders Executives to Leave Argentina

On 10 August, after receipt of a tape-recorded extortion demand from the People's Revolutionary Army (ERP), the Coca Cola Export Corporation ordered all 25 of its executives and their families to leave Argentina. The ERP demanded the company donate \$1 million to charity or face unspecified violence. The company has instructed its Argentine subsidiary not to pay any money to the ERP. (Comment: This is not the first time that Coca Cola has been the target of terrorists. On 21 May Oscar Castell, the manager of the local bottling works in Cordoba, was kidnapped and later released after the company paid \$100 thousand in ransom. On 4 July executive Norman Lee was kidnapped by a group of armed men but released after Lee convinced them that they would get no ransom. For background on the ERP see the 30 May issue, page 8.) 10 August 1973	Beirut, Lebanon Haifa, Israel	Iraqi Airways flight 006A to Baghdad was intercepted by two Israeli fighters and forced to fly to northern Israel.
