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II. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON Met with David Bushong. As Bushong saw the Subcommittee activities, they are pointing toward approximately a week of hearings in the fall to deal with some or all of the following matters: classification (a new Executive Order replacing E.O. 11652 is expected by 15 September 1977), compartmentation, declassification, unauthorized disclosure, and espionage.



Marshall admitted that CIA letters are separately classified but that letters from some other elements, such as the FBI, are not. I agreed to talk to representatives from other Agencies to relay this point for Marshall.
- 12.
