Indonesia-Malaysia: President Sukarno announced yesterday that Indonesia will not recognize the projected Malaysian federation and may withdraw from the Indonesia-Malaya-Philippines heads-of-state conference scheduled for 30 July.

His announcement is in reaction to the agreement signed in London on 9 July to establish the Malaysian federation. The federation will include Malaya, Singapore, Sarawak, North Borneo, and possibly Brunei. It is scheduled to be formally inaugurated on 31 August. Sukarno claimed that Malayan Prime Minister Rahman had broken a promise that a referendum would be conducted in the Borneo territories before Malaysia was formed.

Indonesian Foreign Minister Subandrio had stated the previous day that Indonesia would resume "active confrontation" against Malaya if the Borneo territories were "forced into Malaysia without their agreement by principle of self-determination." Although Indonesia abandoned its overt opposition to Malaysia about 1 June,

<u>USSR--Middle East</u>: Moscow is stepping up its efforts to bring international pressure on Iraq to halt military operations against the Kurds.

The Soviet statement of 9 July renewed Moscow's attacks on the Baath regime and charged that CENTO members and Syria are undertaking "joint measures" against the Kurds. This allegation is apparently designed to refute Baghdad's claim that the Kurdish problem is strictly an internal Iraqi affair and to establish a basis for an appeal for UN or other international action in the matter. On 10 July, the USSR stated that it may call for a meeting of the UN Security Council to consider the Kurdish issue.

Moscow may also intend to use these charges to revive its 1957 proposals for a great-power declaration renouncing the use of force in the Middle East and banning interference in the internal affairs of the area. Renewed proposals along these lines presumably would be aimed at testing Western reaction to broadening the scope of the East-West dialogue.

East Africa: East African leaders are threatening a "hardened attitude" toward the US if Tanganyika President Nyerere's talks on South Africa with President Kennedy next week are not productive.

Tom Mboya, Kenya's Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs, told the US consul general in Nairobi that Nyerere will ask the US to support African efforts to exclude South Africa from all international bodies, to cut off US investment in South Africa, and to embargo US arms shipments to South Africa. Mboya implied that the projected East African federation would turn east if the US was standoffish to Nyerere's requests, and mentioned possible trade agreements with the bloc

(Uganda and Tanganyika already sell cotton to Communist China and, according to Mboya, Hungary has agreed to buy Kenyan coffee. Tanganyika has trade agreements with Yugoslavia, Poland, and Czechoslovakia and is negotiating an agreement with East Germany.
