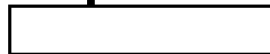


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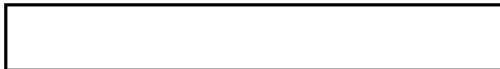
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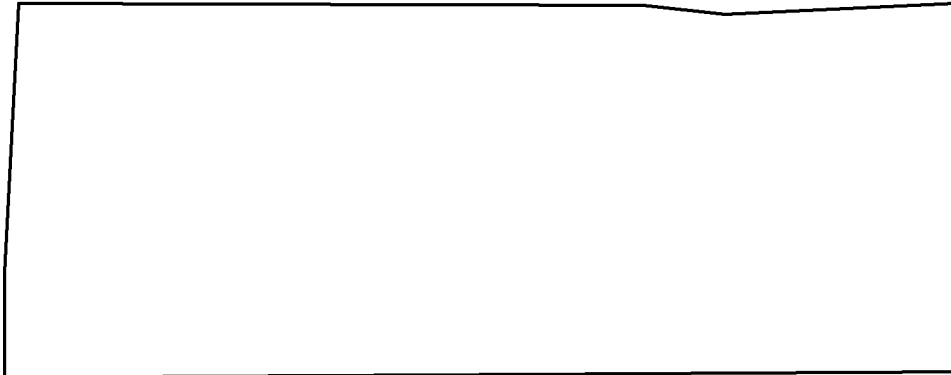
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North Korea - South Korea: Yesterday's raid on a South Korean guard post in the demilitarized zone (DMZ) increases the prospect of cross-border forays by the South.

[redacted] the raid caused no South Korean casualties, but one uniformed North Korean body was found. Armed incidents along the DMZ, which resulted in some 29 fatalities during last October and November, are unusual at this time of year because of bad weather.

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The ROK defense minister will probably use this incident to buttress his case for more aggressive retaliatory action. The strongest South Korean response in recent years occurred after the North Korean ambush of a US patrol on 2 November. On the following day four separate raids were carried out against North Korean positions in the DMZ.



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Nicaragua: Violence is expected today in another effort to disrupt the elections scheduled for Sunday.

Disorders are also predicted at some of the polling places on Sunday, and there are rumors among student groups that extremist opposition groups will start guerrilla activity the following week.

No major outbreak seems likely, since the national guard is on the alert and in firm control of the cities. However, small-scale incidents and individual terrorist acts are probable.

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
