JAMAICA-CUBA: Jamaica intends to establish either a consular or diplomatic resident mission in Cuba in the near future [redacted]

[redacted] At present, Cuba has a consulate in Kingston but Jamaica's business with Havana is handled by the British Government. Charter Cubana aircraft periodically fly between the two islands, and Jamaica also has bunkered Soviet ships involved in Cuban trade.



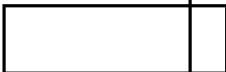
