25X1	The US-sponsored evacuation planned for today has been postponed for at least two or three days at the request of Palestine Liberation Organization chief Yasir Arafat. He warned embassy officials that the proposed convoy route has "suddenly" become unsafe near Nabatiyah, and that it will take several days to resolve the problem.						
25X1	Arafat did not spell out the nature of the difficulty, but he referred to the presence of a contingent of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine—a radical fedayeen group—in one of the villages along the route, and to the killing of three Libyan members of the Arab League peace—keeping force.
