Week Ending 16 June 1978

1. (U) Midwest College Placement Association: From 31 May through 2 June, Recruiter ██████████ participated in the Annual Spring Meeting of the Midwest College Placement Association (MCPA) held in Indianapolis. Some 400 college placement officers and recruiters were in attendance. The format of the meeting was a series of 15 workshops; each participant could attend five. The workshops provided for an exchange of ideas on such topics as effective employee selection systems, training and recruiters, building a college relations program, and other issues of interest to employer representatives and placement officials. ██████████ reports that the meeting was very valuable as a learning experience as well as a means of making recruitment contacts.

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2. (U) Hispanic Convention: Recruiter ██████████ reports that the IMAGE (Hispanic) Convention, June 7-9, went well and that the Agency display was well received. He reports that he heard several comments that CIA's display and the one from the Coast Guard were the best. ██████████ accepted five resumes and gave out forms to about ten delegates who said they would be in further touch for interviews.

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3. (C) Retirement Activity: The figures shown below depict the total retirement activity for the period 1 January through 30 June 1978. The figures in the clear show totals. The figures in parentheses represent persons who have opted for discontinued service or "involuntary" retirement; the figures in parentheses are included in the total figure. Thus, of 244 persons to go by 30 June, 106 are going under the "liberal" options.

4. (U) Handicapped Program: [REDACTED] will enter on duty on 17 July 1978. She will be the first blind applicant to enter through the Career Training Program. Her scheduled assignment following completion of the program will be with NFAC/Office of Regional and Political Analysis. 25X1A

5. (U) Civil Service Reform Bill: [REDACTED], OP/Plans Staff, attended markup sessions of the Civil Service Reform Bill by the Senate Government Affairs Committee on 12 and 14 June. 25X1A

6. (U/AIUO) Possible Dock Strike: Central Processing Branch has been advised that there is a possibility of a U.S. West Coast dock strike beginning 1 July 1978. Discussions are currently under way between the Pacific Maritime Associations and the International Longshoreman's and Warehouseman's Union to negotiate new contracts. According to our sources, both sides seem to be optimistic that a settlement can be reached without a work stoppage. However, if the strike does occur, the entire West Coast from Seattle to San Diego will be affected. This, of course, will have a serious effect on all shipments consigned to or transiting from the West Coast and may very well affect many of our shipments.

7. (U) Blood Donor Day: Due to possible demonstration activities, Blood Donor Day had to be postponed until 12 June. As a result, the number of donors (132) was down slightly as compared to June 1977 (165).

8. (C) Length-of-Service Certificates: Each year we begin the presentation of Agency length-of-service certificates during the annual awards ceremony in September. We are now well along in the preparation of this year's certificates. Computer runs have been checked and verified and a request to print the certificates has been forwarded to Printing and Photography Division. This year, 2,248 employees will be eligible for certificates, as follows:

9. (U) Redskin Ticket Drawing: The Employee Activities Association held its annual drawing for the purchase of Redskin tickets on Tuesday, 13 June. There were 1,675 applications which was up slightly over last year. Since there are eight home games this year, we will have 1,000 winners, each of whom can purchase two tickets. Winners are now being notified and tickets will be available 19-22 June.

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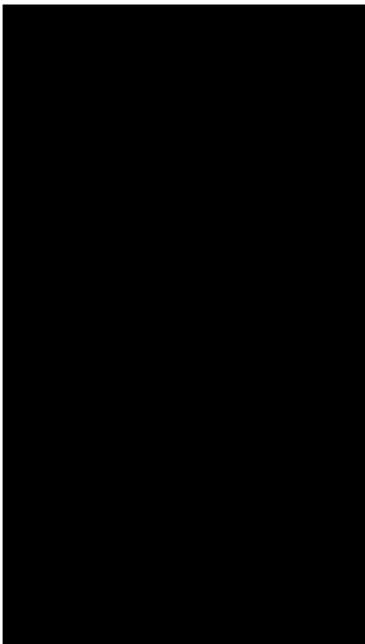
