1. The organization of the Chinese universities has been radically changed under Communist rule. The colleges or departments of science, for example, from various universities are now all located in what were formerly the buildings of a university. The agricultural departments of all the former universities are grouped in some other university's buildings. This gives the impression that present-day Chinese universities are highly specialized. More important, this practice breaks the former chain of command of the universities. Most of the former faculty members have been retained but are now grouped with entirely different and unknown professors, and the new organization is headed by trusted Communists. The new universities are then renamed, usually with a name like "People's University of Science."
2. The Peking Union Medical College has been converted to a hospital. There are no teaching facilities there now. Many of the former faculty have been sent to other locations in China.
3. The Communist "People's Institute of Medical Research" in Shanghai carried out a research project on "tissue therapy" in late 1952 and early 1953. This project was to inject various body tissues from healthy animals into sick animals in an attempt to cure various diseases. Pieces of animal liver, for example, were ground up, made into a solution, and then the preparation was injected into sick animals to see if it would have any effect upon disease of those animal
4. The new government has brought many Soviet scientists and doctors into China. As a result, Soviet methods and procedures now 1953 prevail in Chinese medical and scientific procedures. In most cases, Soviets have been placed in charge of the Chinese medical and scientific institutions. Under the Communists, doctors have three alternatives:
  - (a) They can remain in private practice under close supervision and with ~~the~~ no means of securing needed drugs and medicines.

(b) They can serve in the Chinese Army Medical Corps.

(c) They can teach in Communist colleges.

Most of the well-trained doctors have been drafted into the army. A great number of doctors and scientists have committed suicide rather than submit to Communist domination. [redacted] good many doctors have committed suicide because they find it impossible to practice medicine under the new regime in accordance with the principles of their profession.
