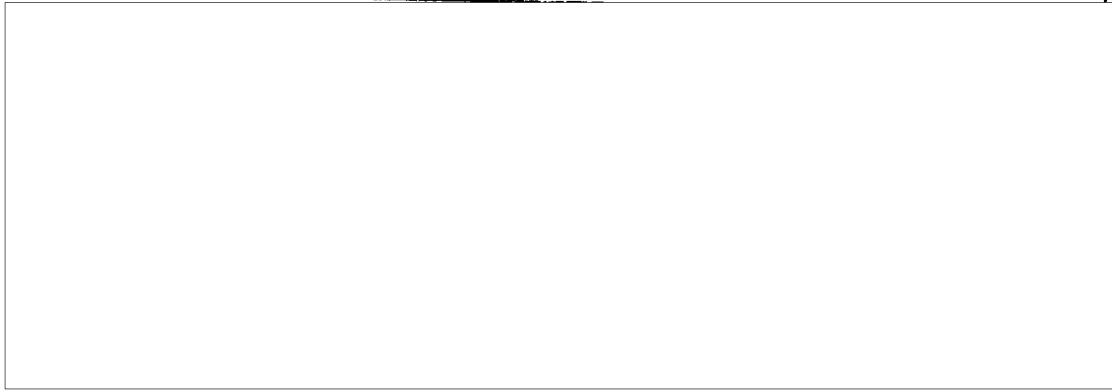

2. The Chief Directorate for Soviet Property Abroad - abbreviated "GUSIMZ" - was created after World War II and is located in Moscow. The following organizations are subordinate to this chief directorate:

Directorate for Soviet Property in Germany ("USIG"),
Directorate for Soviet Property in Austria ("USIA");

There were also directorates for Soviet Property in Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Rumania, China.

The Chief Directorate itself is an independent organization and is not a part of any ministry.

3. The official purpose of "GUSIMZ" is to keep a record of, and to arrange storage for, property belonging to the USSR and located abroad. Actually, the functions of the Directorate are much broader and are directed toward obtaining for the USSR a lion's share of the production of countries occupied by Soviet Forces at below cost prices.

4. The Directorate for Soviet Property in Germany, "USIG", was located in the Eastern Sector of Berlin as late as 1942. The Directorate is headed by a General, whose name is Kabulov. The Directorate has the following divisions:

- (a) Technical Division
- (b) Planning Division
- (c) Cadres (personnel) Division
- (d) Transport Division
- (e) Division of Supply
- (f) Accounting
- (g) Administrative-management Division
- (h) Secret Coding Division
- (i) Division of Counter-espionage
- (j) Political Division
- (k) Translators
- (l) Bureau of Passes

Germans as well as Russians work in the Directorate.

The Soviet Joint-stock Society (SAO), "BRIKET", "TRANSMASH" and others are subordinated to "USIG". In addition, the activity of the "VISMUT" combine, which carries out the prospecting and mining of uranium is tied in with the activity of "USIG".

5. [redacted] the administration of "USIG" even had the right to interfere in the actions of the Soviet Occupation Forces.

The "USIG" administration demonstrated that they had more greater rights than the military and the SKK administration in dealing concerning valuable materials.

6. "USIG" activity was evidenced in the following incident. [redacted] three large warehouses of machinery and mechanisms which included generators, cranes, excavators, cement-mixers, lawnmowers, transformers, compressors, trailers, Diesels, gasoline motors and many other things. [redacted] obliged to compile monthly reports on the movement and technical condition of all this for transmittal to "USIG".

7. [redacted] the Leipzig affiliate of the Directorate for Soviet Property in Germany was located in the same building as the SKK representative on Gelliser Strasse (phonetic) in the center of Leipzig. This affiliate through its representatives supervised the joint-stock societies "BRIKET" and "TRANSMASH". [redacted] metal construction plants in Leipzig -- "Blanchert", and "Unruh und Lischich" (phonetic). [redacted] "USIG" keeps a scrupulous record of everything produced by these plants and selects the best to be shipped to the USSR. [redacted] "USIG" has had its representatives in German, so-called people's enterprises. These are nationalized enterprises, not a part of any joint-stock societies and under the direction of German administrations, but "USIG" supervises the activity of these plants, keeps a production record, exercises qualitative control and selects the best production for shipping to the USSR.

8. The Directorate for Soviet Property in Germany plays the main part in the export of German factory and plant production into the USSR, as well as all sorts of materials.

- 9. In addition to reparations, production was shipped out of Germany to the USSR under the guise of purchases obtained at extremely low prices dictated by the USSR. As a result of such policies, German industry operates at a loss which in turn places a burden upon the German people.
- 10. "USIG" is provided with exceptionally great powers in technical and materials problems.
- 11. In conclusion it should be noted that the "USIG" administration handles security clearances of all Germans hired as employees of jointstock companies.
- 12. The Directorate for Soviet Property in Austria is similar to that in Germany.
