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SOURCE Rude Pravo, No 16, 1949. (Information requested.)NEW OKRES ORGANIZATION IN BOHEMIA AND MORAVIA

Bohemia and Moravia were divided by the previous territorial organization into 156 okres. Under the new territorial organization there will now be a total of 180 okres.

In Prague Kraj are the statutory city of Prague and the following 26 okres: Benesov, Beroun, Brandys nad Labem, Cesky Brod, Dobruška (newly established), Horovice, Kladno, Kolin, Kralupy nad Vltavou, Kutna Hora, Melnik, Mlada Boleslav, Nove Strazec (newly established), Nymburk, Pobebrady, Prague-rural district-south, Prague-rural district-north, Prague-rural district-east (newly established), Prague-rural district-west (newly established), Pribram, Rakovnik, Ricany, Sedlcan, Slany, Vlasim, and Votice (newly established). The former okres of Jilove has been abolished.

Ceske Budejovice Kraj has 15 okres: Ceske Budejovice, Cesky Krumlov, Jindrichuv Hradec, Kaplice, Milevsko, Pisek, Prachatic, Sobeslav (newly established), Strakonice, Tabor, Trhove Sviny (newly established), Trebon, Tyn nad Vltavou, Vimperk (newly established), and Vodnany (newly established).

Pilsen Kraj consists of the statutory city of Pilsen and 14 ^[sic] okres: Blatna, Blatna (newly established), Domazlice, Horad'ovice (nowly established), Horsovy Tyn, Jistovy, Plazy (where the seat of the Okres National Committee has been transferred from Kralovice), Pilsen-rural district, Prestice, Rokycany Stod (newly established), Stribro, Sunice, and Tachov. The following obec (towns) have been added to the statutory city of Pilsen, and simultaneously separately from the territory of Pilsen-rural district okres: Cerveny Hradek, Litice, and Radobycice.

Karlovy Vary Kraj has 10 okres: As, Cheb, Jachymov, Kadan, Karlovy Vary, Kraslice, Mariansko Lazne, Podborany, Sokolov, and Touzim (where the seat of the Okres National Committee has been transferred from the city of Tepla). The following former okres have been abolished: Loket, Nejdek, Plana, Tejprty, and Zlutice. The territory of As Okres is unchanged.

Usti nad Labem Kraj has 13 okres: Bilina, Decin, Duchcov, Horni Litvnov (newly established), Chomutov, Litomerice, Louny, Lovosice (newly established), Most, Roudnice nad Labem, Teplice, Usti nad Labem, and Zatec.

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Liberec Kraj consists of the statutory city of Liberec and 11 okres: Ceska Lipa, Doksy (where the seat of the Okres National Committee has been transferred from Duba), Frydlant, Jablonec nad Nisou, Jilemnice, Liberec-rural district, Mnichovo Hradiste, Novy Bor (newly established), Rumburk, Semily, and Turnov. The former okres of Jablonec v Podještědí has been abolished. The former okres of Rumburk, Sluknov, and Varnsdorf have been combined into a single okres, with the seat of the Okres National Committee in Rumburk. The territory of the okres of Frydlant and Jilemnice remains unchanged.

Hradec Kralove Kraj has 14 okres: Broumov, Dobruska, Dvur Kralove nad Labem, Horice, Hradec Kralove, Jaromer, Jicin, Nachod, Nova Paka, Novy Bydov, Rychnov nad Kneznou, Trutnov, Vrchlabi, and Zamberk. The former okres of Dobruska has been combined with the former okres of Nove Mesto nad Metuji into a single okres, with the seat in Dobruska. The territory of the okres of Nova Paka remains unchanged.

Pardubice Kraj has 12 ^[sic] okres: Caslav, Hlinsko (newly established), Holice (newly established), Chotebor, Lanskroun, Litomysl, Pardubice, Policka, Prelonc (newly established), Usti nad Orlici, and Vysoke Myto.

Jihlava Kraj has 13 ^[sic] okres: Dacice, Havlickuv Brod, Humpolec, Jihlava, Kamenice nad Lipou, Ledec nad Sazavou, Moravske Budejovice, Pacov (newly established), Pelhrimov, Trebic (newly established), Velke Mezirici, and Zdar (where the seat of the Okres National Committee has been transferred from Nove Mesto na Morave).

Brno Kraj consists of the statutory city of Brno and 18 okres: Blansko (newly established), Boskovice, Brno-rural district, Breclav (newly established), Bucovice (newly established), Bystrice nad Pernstejnem (newly established), Hustopece, Mikulov, Moravska Trebova, Moravsky Krumlov, Rosice (newly established), Slavkov u Brna (newly established), Svitavy (newly established), Tisnov, Velka Bites (newly established), Vyskov, Znojmo, and Zidlochovice (newly established).

Olomouc Kraj consists of the statutory city of Olomouc and 12 okres: Bruntal, Hranice, Jesenik, Kojetin (newly established), Litovel, Olomouc-rural district, Prostějov, Přerov, Rymarov, Sternberk, Šumperk, and Záhřeb ^[sic]; probably should be Záhřeb/. The former okres of Moravský Beroun has been abolished. The territory of Šumperk Okres remains unchanged.

Gottwaldov Kraj has 11 okres: Gottwaldov, Hodonin, Hořesov, Kromeriz, Kyjov, Uherske Hradiste, Uhersky Brod, Valasske Klobouky (newly established), Valasske Mezirici, Veseli nad Moravou (newly established), and Vsetin.

Ostrava Kraj consists of the statutory city of Ostrava and 11 okres: Bilovec, Český Tesin, Frenstat pod Radhoštem (newly established), Fryštát, Hlučín, Krnov, Místek, Nový Jičín, Opava, Ostrava-rural district (newly established), and Vítkov (newly established).

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
