"MET" EXPERIMENTAL TELEVISION TRANSMITTER

At the Radio Engineering Faculty of the Moscow Order of Lenin Power Institute (Molotov), a group of young scientific collaborators and students under the leadership of Prof. G. V. Brandt, Laureate of the Stalin Prize, designed and are presently constructing an experimental television transmitter, the MET.

The transmitter will operate with a definition of 625 lines. In the photograph (CIA Photo Accession No 4416) in the foreground, the youngest scientific collaborator, S. Popov, and student L. Romanuk are making adjustments on the transmitter. At the transmitter cabinet are assistant V. Klimushin and laboratory worker V. Bychkov at work.

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
