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Georgian industry as a whole completed 104 percent of the second-quarter gross-production plan, with Union and republic industry 104 percent, and the second quarter 1948, including union industry 20 percent, and the second quarter 1948, including union industry 20 percent, and the second quarter 1948, including union industry 20 percent.

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Industrial cooperatives fulfilled 104 percent of the second-quarter gross-production plan, including the Administration of Industrial Cooperatives, Council of Ministers Georgian SSR, 103 percent, and the Georgian Union of Industrial Cooperatives 106 percent.

The Administration of Industrial Cooperatives however, did not fulfill the plan for the production of brick, tile, beds, nails, hauling of commercial timber, lumber, furniture, shoes, wool fabric, and vegetable oil. The Georgian Union of Invalids' Cooperatives failed to complete the plan for the production of beds, nails, household dish ware, lumber, shoes, cloth, knitted outer garments, hosiery, and sausage products.

Despite the late spring and delayed growing season, cultivation operations are being carried out successfully. By 15 July, 100 percent of the third and 74 percent of the fourth weeding of cotton fields, 98 percent of the first and 90 percent of the second weeding of tobacco, 99 percent of the first and 85 percent of the second weeding of sunflowers, 98 percent of the first and 69 percent of the second weeding of corn, and 97 percent of the first and 77 percent of the second earthing up of potatoes had been completed. By 15 July, the fallow plowing plan had been completed 100 percent and the fallow cultivation plan 44 percent. The half-year plan for conversion of tractor operations to soft tillage was exceeded 13 percent by 1 July.

Mass harvesting of grain is being carried out in some regions of the republic. Harvesting of indigenous hay was completed 19 percent by 15 July.

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The second-quarter plan for centralized capital construction projects was completed 93 percent by the entire Georgian national economy, including 85 percent of union construction projects and 85 percent of union and union-republic construction projects. Completed capital construction during the first 6 months of 1968 was 19 percent greater than during the corresponding period of 1967, including a 12-percent increase in union construction projects and a 65-percent increase in union-republic and republic construction projects.

The Transcaucasus Railroad completed 100.2 percent of its second-quarter average daily loading plan and 82 percent of its average daily unloading plan. The loading plan for coal was completed 92 percent, for manganese ore 94 percent, and for petroleum products 141 percent.

The second-quarter retail commodity turnover plan was completed 95 percent. Individual trade systems and organizations completed the second-quarter commodity turnover plan as follows:
