CCP GOVERNMENTS NAME OFFICIALS

NORTHEAST ESTABLISHES PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT -- Hua Shang Pao, 30 Aug 49

Chen-jung, 29 August -- On 27 August 1949, the Northeast People's Government Council (wei-yuan-hui) held its first meeting. At this meeting the following government officials were elected: Kao Kang (高岗), chairman (chu-hsi) of the Northeast People's Government; Li Fu-ch'un (李富春), Lin Feng (林楓), Kao Ch'ung-min (高崇民), deputy chairmen of the Northeast People's Government; Lin Feng, chief (chu-jen) of the Staff Office (pan-kung t'ing); Li Yu-wen (李又文) [also written Su Yu-wen (苏又文) in other Hong Kong papers], Secretary General (ai-shu-chang); Wang Kuang-wei (王光偉), Deputy Secretary General [also written Wang Chiao-wei (王覺偉) in other Hong Kong papers];

Kao Kang, chief of Finance and Economics Committee (ts'ai-cheng ching-wei wei-yuan-hui); Li Fu-ch'un, Lin Feng, Yeh Chi-chuang (葉季壯), deputy chiefs of the Finance and Economics Committee; Lin Feng, chief of the Inspection Committee (chien-sh'a wei-yuan hui); Wang I-fu (王一夫) head of the Executive Ministry (hsing-cheng pu chang); Ku Cho-hsin (顧卓新), Minister of Finance (ts'ai-cheng pu chang); Ni wei (倪偉), Deputy Minister of Finance; Wang Ho-shou (王和壽) [also written Wang Hao-shou (王鶴壽) in other Hong Kong newspapers], Minister of Heavy Industry (chung kung-yeh pu chang); Lu Tung (呂東), An Chih-wen (安志文), Deputy Ministers of Heavy Industry; Tu Che-heng (杜若衡), Minister of Agriculture and Forestry (nung-lin pu chang);

Ch'e Hsiang-shen (卓向忱), Minister of Culture and Education (wen-hua chiao-yü pu chang); Tung Shun-ts'ai (董純才) and Tsou Lu-feng (鄒魯風), Deputy Ministers of Culture and Education; Wang Chin-heiang (汪金祥) [also known as Wang Ch'ing-hsiang (汪情祥) in other Hong Kong papers], Minister of Public Security (kung-an pu chang); Ch'en Lung (陳龍), Deputy Minister of Public Security; Kao Ch'ung-min, Minister of Justice (sü-fa pu chang), concurrently head of the Northeast People's Court; Wang Pin (王斌), Minister of Health (wei-sheng pu chang);

Shen-yang, 29 August (NCNA) -- The People's Delegate Assembly (jen min tai-piao hui-i) was formally opened on 21 August 1949 and adjourned on 26 August 1949. On 26 August 1949 the Northeast People's Government was formally created.

On 21 and 22 August 1949, Lin Feng, the chairman of the Northeast Executive Committee (hsing-cheng wei-yuan-hui), and Kao Kang, the secretary (shu-chi) of the Northeast Bureau of the CCP Central Committee (chung-kung chung-yang tung-pei chü), gave individual reports on the activities of the Northeast Government covering the past 3 years and the future aims of the administration. On the third and fourth days, the 11 delegation groups were divided into small groups to study the two reports, which were later supported by the whole body.

On the fourth day each representative was given an opportunity to voice his opinion. Besides the speeches made by group leaders (t'uan chang), representatives of workers, army personnel, farmers, women, educators, youths, businessmen, and a few racial groups also discussed methods of achieving the future aims of the administration. Speeches made by Kao Ch'ung-min, of the Northeast Branch of the China Democratic League (CDL), and Independents Ch'e Hsiang-shen and Tu Kuang-yü (杜光宇), expressed approval of the aims set forth and appreciation was voiced for the aid granted by the CCP and the Northeast Executive Committee.

It was also recognized, at the meeting, that the people of the Northeast must enter into an austerity program, increase production, learn constructively from Soviet Russia, and practice scientific methods before important tasks may be completed.

On the fifth day, the Assembly passed the principles of organization of the Northeast People's Government and also measures governing the election of members to the Northeast People's Government Council. The Secretary of the Northeast Bureau, Li Fu-ch'un, represented the Resolutions Review Committee (t'i-an shen-ch'a wei-yuan-hui), making a report on the submitted proposals. They included the 584 motions submitted, which had been divided and transferred to six subcommittees (hsiao-tsu): government, finance and economics, culture and education, health, public security and judicial, and military. First the proposals were discussed in the subcommittees and then by the entire committee. As a result of the review, the committee reported that the administration program should aim at restoring production and practicing economy as means of expanding industry and improving living standards. Several resolutions which could not be applied at present, in view of these standards, were not accepted.

The entire assembly applauded and passed the report of the Soviet Committee.

On the final day, 26 August 1949, the assembly elected the council members of the Northeast Government. Included among the forty-one regular council members elected were: Kao Yang, Li Fu-ch'un, Lin Feng, Kao Ch'ung-min, Chang Wei-chen, Chang Chu-hu (張注湖), Wu Hsiu-ch'uan (伍修權), Chang Hsueh-szu (張學思), Ch'e Hsiang-chen, Ch'en Hsien-chou, Liu Ya-hsiung, female, (劉亞雄), Yu I-fu (殷夫), Han T'ien-shih (韓天石), Chu Te-hai (朱德海), Liu Ying-yuan (劉英源), and Li Kuo-chuan (李國鈞). Among the eleven alternates elected were: Jao Pin (賈斌), Li Yen-lu (李延祿), Pei Hsi-ch'ing (白希清), Wang Chih-hai (王之聖), and Teng Chao-hsiang (鄧兆祥).

Prior to adjournment, the Assembly voted six very important decisions:

1. Approval of the resolutions submitted by the Northeast Bureau to the Northeast People's Delegate Assembly which were concerned with the administrative program of the Northeast People's Government.
2. Approval of the report of the government's activities covering the past 3 years, given by Lin Feng, chairman of the Northeast Executive Committee.
3. Support of the new Political Consultative Conference, and the speedy establishment of a democratic coalition government.
4. Strengthening of the activities of the Sino-Soviet Friendship Society and the relations between the Russian and Chinese peoples.
5. Support of the one-year trade pact between the USSR and the Northeast People's Government.
6. Supplement austerity, anti-waste, conservation of capital, and other measures designed to benefit economic reconstruction and aid the entire nation.

Li Fu-ch'un made the closing remarks, stating that the success of the 6-day meeting may be attributed to the cooperation of the various classes of people in the Northeast.

Pei-p'ing, 22 August (MCNA) -- The Shansi and Pingyuan governments were formally established on 19 and 20 August 1949, respectively. Various officials of the new governments have been appointed by the North China People's Government:
