LISTS DAILY EVENTS OF CPC

21 September

Conference chairmen for the day: Mao Tse-tung, Chu Te, Li Chi-shen, Shen Chun-ju and Kuo Mo-jo; 635 delegates and 300 guests present, including 27 domestic and four foreign news reporters; conference time, 4 hours.

1. Prior to opening of the conference, Chou En-lai reported on the number of conference delegates in the various delegation units, and on the number who had arrived in Pei-p'ing.
2. Conference convened at 1900 hours.
3. Approval of election of 89 members of the presidium and chief of the Secretariat (Mi-shu ch'u).
4. Approval by the presidium, in the name of the assembly, of a message of condolence to the family of Gen Yang Chieh of the EMTRC, who was assassinated in Hong Kong on 19 September 1949.
5. Declaration by Mao Tse-tung indicating matters to be taken up by the assembly in the course of the conference.
6. Statements by Liu Shao-chi, Sung Ch'ing-ling, Ho Hsiang-ning, Chang-lan, Kuo Kang, Huang Yen-p'ei, Ch'en I, Li Li-san, Sai Fu-tung, Chang Chih-chung, Ch'eng Ch'ien, and Sau-t'u Mei-t'ang.

22 September

Conference chairmen for the day: Liu Shao-chi, Ho Hsiang-ning, Ch'en I, Huang Yen-p'ei and Chang Po-chung; 635 delegates present; conference time, 3 hours and 30 minutes.

1. Four reports by the Preparatory Committee of the conference by the following: Lin Po-ch'u, head of the Committee Secretariat, on activities of the Committee; T'an P'ing-shan, head of subcommittee No 2, on the draft of the Organic Law of the CPPC; Tung Pi-wu, head of subcommittee No 3, on the Organic Law of the Central People's Government of the China People's Republic; and Chou En-lai, head of subcommittee No 3 [sic], on the Common Program (kung-t'ung kang-ling) of the CPPC.

2. Approval of the decisions of the first session of the Presidium, which included a) establishment of a standing committee of 31 members; b) appointment of nine deputy secretaries general; c) passage of the conference procedural regulations of the first plenary session of the CPPC; d) establishment of five committees: (1) for revising the Organic Law of the CPPC, (2) for drafting the Common Program of the CPPC, (3) for drafting the Organic Law of the Central People's Government, (4) for drafting the CPPC plenary session declaration, and (5) for reviewing proposals for a national flag, emblem, capital, and calendar; and e) establishment of a committee to review delegates' resolutions.

#### 23 September

Conference chairmen for the day: Ma Yin-ch'u, Chang Chi-jo, Wu-lan-fu, Li Te-ch'uan, and Ch'en Yun; 626 delegates present.

1. Statements by Li Chi-shen, Huang K'o-ch'eng, Liu Po-ch'eng, Fu Tso-i, Ch'eng Fang-wu, T'ao Meng-ho, Chang Nai-ch'i, Tu Kuo-hsiang, Su Yu, Ch'en Po-ta, Liao Ch'eng-chih, Ch'en Ming-shu, Ch'en Shu-t'ung, Ts'ai T'ing-chieh, Shen Yen-ping, Liang Hsi, Hsieh Hsueh-hung, and Hu Ch'iao-mu.

2. Appointment of groups to deliberate on the design of a new national flag and emblem.

3. Mao Tse-tung and Chu Te hold welcome banquet for Ch'eng Ch'ien and Ch'en King-jen.

#### 24 September

Chairmen for the day: Kao Kang, Ma Shu-lun, Ts'ai T'ing-chieh, Ch'en Chia-keng (Tan Kah-kee), and Shih Liang; 626 delegates present; conference time: 4 hours 20 minutes.

1. Continuation of statements by unit delegates Chu Te, Shen Chun-ju, Ch'en Chia-keng, Ma Ming-fang, Shao Li-tzu, Kao Ch'ung-min, P'eng Tse-min, Liu Ying-yuan, Chang Yun-i, Wu-lan-fu, Chang Nan-hsien, Sha Ch'ien-li, Mei Lan-fang, Ch'en Ch'i-yu, Ch'en Chin-k'un, Teng Ying-ch'ao, P'an Chen-ya, Feng Wen-pin, Shao Wen-han, Hsu Te-heng, Lien Kuan, and Hsieh Pang-ting.

2. Presentation of a flag by the All-China Federation of Labor to the assembly.

3. Presentation by Sinkiang delegates of a flag to the assembly and a Uighur cap and jacket to Mao Tse-tung.

4. Presentation of flags to Mao Tse-tung and Chu Te by the Mohammedan delegates from the Northwest.

5. Press conference held by representatives of religious groups.

25 September

Chairmen for the day: T'an P'ing-shan, Liu Po-ch'eng, Ts'ai Ch'ang, Liu Ko-p'ing, and Tung Pi-wu; conference time, 3 hours 40 minutes.

1. Continuation of statements by delegates Kuo Mo-jo, Liu Hsiao, Ho Lung, Chu Hsueh-fan, Ch'en Ming-jen, Po I-po, Liu Ko-p'ing, Ma Shu-lun, Chang Hua, Teng Pao-san, Chang Lan-feng, Chiang Kuang-nai, Huang Shao-hung, Huang Ching, Chu Chun-hsin, Wu Ch'i-wei, Li Hsiu-chen, Wu Yao-tsung, Ch'ien Ch'ang-chao, and Chou Hsin-fang.

2. Flowers and congratulatory messages sent to Mao Tse-tung and Chu Te by the Pei-p'ing Democratic Women's Federation and delegates from Inner Mongolia.

26 September

The conference held a one-day recess, but extra-conference activities continued.

1. The committee for revision of the proposed national flag, national emblem, location of the capital city, and a new calendar system held a meeting.

2. Individual meetings of the committees to revise the drafts of the Organic Law of the CPPC, the Organic Law of the Central People's Government, and the Resolutions Revision Committee (t'i-an cheng-li wei-yuan-hui).

27 September

The day's meeting was held in two sessions. Chairmen of the first session were Chang Ian, Li Li-san, Ho Lung, Shen Yen-ping, and Po I-po; chairmen of the second session were Chou En-lai, Sung Ch'ing-ling, Chang Yun-i, Ch'ea Shu-lun, and Sai Fu-ting. Delegates present were 632.

1. Statements by delegates Li Jen-jen, A-li-mu-chiang, Ian Kung-wu, Teng Chao-hsiang, Fan Hsiao-feng, Chan Ch'ung, Huang Ch'i-hsiang, Wang Kuo-hsing, Lin Li-ju, Chu Te-hai, Chu Ming-kuan, T'ien Fu-ta, T'ien Pao, Wang Shih-ming, Lo Lung-chi, Liu Shan-pen, Li Ch'eng-kan, Yang Cheng-min, Chang Hsueh-suu, Liu Ch'ing-yang, Chao Shou-shan, Li Hsi-chiu, Chang Chen, Li Te, and Li Tsun.

2. Adoption of six major drafts: Organic Law of the CPPC, Organic Law of the Central People's Government of the China People's Republic, moving of the capital to Pei-p'ing, renaming Pei-ching as of 27 September 1949, use of the modern international calendar, use of the Heroic Army March as the provisional national anthem, and designation of the national flag.

3. Decision that the conference recess for one day on 28 September.

4. Presentation of flowers and flags to Mao Tse-tung, Chu Te, and the assembly by the All-China Democratic Youth Federation and Overseas Chinese.

28 September

One-day recess; however, extra-conference activities continued as follows:

1. Announcement of CPPC achievements and slogans commemorating the establishment of the new Chinese government.

2. Announcement by the presidium of the measurements to be followed in manufacturing the national flag.

3. Afternoon meetings of various delegation units and the committee to revise the draft of the Common Program.

29 September

1. Discussion and adoption of the following drafts: Common Program of the CPCC, appointments to six vice-presidency and 56 government council posts, regulations governing election to the National Council of the CPCC and the Council of the Central People's Government, and the report of the Presidium regarding the review of resolutions entered by conference delegates and the telegram sent to the UN in the name of the CPCC objecting to RMT representation of China in the UN.

2. Promulgation of three major documents, the Organic Law of the CPCC, the Common Program of the CPCC, and the Organic Law of the Central People's Government of the China People's Republic.

3. Designation of 1-3 October as holidays for all government agencies, schools, factories, and troop units throughout the country, except those whose activities may not be suspended, in commemoration of the establishment of the new government.

30 September

1. Elections -- 180 members to the National Council of the CPCC, president and vice-presidents of the central people's Government, 56 members of the Council of the Central People's Government.

2. Adoption and issuance of the declaration made by the first plenary session of the CPCC.

3. Approval of congratulatory telegrams to the liberation armies.

4. Approval of the erection of a memorial tablet in honor of people's heroes who sacrificed their lives for their country.

5. Speech by Chu Te marking the close of the conference.

Acknowledgement was also given each day to reactions at home and abroad regarding conference activities, and to the current domestic military situation.

1 October

Formal proclamation by Mao Tse-tung of the birth of the People's Republic of China and the establishment of the Central People's Government.

Installation of top administrative officials in their new positions.
