PYONGYANG BEING SOVIETIZED

One of the changes brought about by the North Korean puppet regime is the Sovietization of Fyongyang City. For example, the main street running from the railroad station to Moranbong has been renamed "Stalin Street," and the substations along the street-car line are named "Stalin Station No 1, 2, 3, etc." Historic Moranbong is now Molotov Hill, Daidonggang has been renamed Lenin River. The wide street in front of the city hall in Pyongyang is now known as Kim Il Sung Square.
