KMT GUERRILLA ACTIVITY CONTINUES;
KANSU GOVERNOR SAYS 16,000 GUERRILLAS SUPPRESSED

KMT AGENTS DISRUPTING MAINLAND ECONOMY -- Canton Nan-fang Jih-pao, 11 Jul 50

Peiping, 10 July (Hsin-hua) -- The Peiping Jen-min Jih-pao reported that the KMT reactionaries, under the direction of the US imperialists, have been infiltrating special agents into the Chinese mainland to disrupt our economy. The following evidence was printed by the paper:

"In May 1950, our Public Security Bureau uncovered a KMT special agent organization known as the Fifth Detachment, Second Column, Shantung People's Anti-Communist National Salvation Army, at Tsingtao, which has been actively engaged in pilfering warehouses, disrupting transportation, destroying military and industrial installations, printing counterfeit currency, etc., in an attempt to disrupt our economy.

"After the liberation of Hainan, our military forces captured an official document which disclosed a KMT plan to print counterfeit people's notes to cause inflation in our country.

"A KMT special agent unit printing counterfeit currency was uncovered by our authorities in Mei Hsien, Kwangtung."

The paper also reported that many attempts have been made by the KMT special agents to disrupt our railroad lines, such as the Heng-yang--Hankow, Tientsin--F'u-k'ou, Tsingtao--Tsinan, etc. The agents are well-organized, the paper reported, and have been using local civilians to carry out these subversive activities.

KMT special agents are also said to be infiltrating the various industries and popular organizations. In many cases, they have successfully placed themselves in key positions to obtain valuable information. Many accidents and mismanagement of industries can be traced to these agents.

TENG PAO-SHAN REPORTS BANDIT-SUPPRESSION ACTIVITIES -- Hong Kong Hsing-
tao Jih-pao, 31 Jul 50

Feiping, 30 July -- On 26 June 1950, Governor Teng Pao-shan (1) /numbers refer to appended characters/, of Kansu, reported to the Government Administration Council of the Central People's government that more than 16,000 KMT guerrillas were killed, wounded, or captured and that some 34 bandit leaders, including Ma Hsiao-wu, were apprehended in the bandit-suppression campaigns launched in Kansu between September 1949 and February 1950.

He admitted, however, that there are still large numbers of KMT bandits operating in Kansu and that the task is still far from completion. During April and May 1950, he said, reactionary societies, such as the I-kuan-tao (2), Wu-chi-tao (3), Ta-tao-hui (4), staged many armed jail breaks to free the bandits in custody. These societies, he further added, have been creating armed agitation in cities such as Lan-chou, Kao-lan, Ping-liang, T'ien-shui, Ku-yuan, etc., to disrupt peace and order.

He concluded by saying that more than 90,000 persons are now facing starvation, in Kansu as a result of the recent floods. Some 2,289,000 mou of land were inundated, he said, and half of the grazing animals have perished.

DESTROYS 2,700 KMT BANDITS IN MAY -- Canton Nan-fang Jih-pao, 19 Jun 50

The following results in the bandit-suppression campaign launched in May 1950, in the North Kwangsi District, were recently released by the Chinese Communist authorities: (1) 620 killed; (2) 1,277 captured; (3) 767 surrendered and (4) the following equipment captured -- 5 howitzers, one artillery piece, 1,564 rifles, 526 pistols, 9 light machine guns, 3 heavy machine guns, 28,032 rounds of ammunition, 156 hand grenades, one telephone set, and 3 bayonets.

34,000 KMT BANDITS DESTROYED IN KWANGTUNG - Canton Nan-fang Jih-pao,
13 Jul 50

During April, May and June 1950, the Chinese Communist forces of the Kwangtung Military District destroyed or captured more than 34,000 KMT bandits as follows: April -- 5,313, of which 4,246 surrendered voluntarily to our forces; May -- 13,579; June -- 15,356, of which 8,652 surrendered voluntarily to our forces.

Plans are now being made by the authorities to solicit the cooperation of the local inhabitants to destroy the KMT bandits and special agents operating locally. Campaigns against large bandit units are to be carried out by the Chinese Communist forces as in the past.

58,000 BANDITS DESTROYED IN SOUTHERN SZECHWAN IN JUNE -- Hong Kong Wen-hui Pao,
19 Jul 50

Lu-hsien, 17 July (Hsin-hua) -- The Southern Szechwan Military District has reported that the bandit-suppression campaign launched against the KMT bandits operating in the areas south of the Yangtze River and west of Min-chiang, in June 1950, resulted in the suppression of over 58,000 bandits. Of this number, 17,690 were captured, including bandit leaders Liu Meng-lien (5), Liu Te-lung (6), Hu Pa-tuang (7), and many others. It was also reported that a large amount of enemy equipment was captured.

Because of the success of this campaign, according to the reports, water and highway communications of this area have been restored to normalcy.

BANDITS DESTROYED IN SOUTHERN HUNAN -- Hong Kong Wen-hui Pao, 20 Jul 50

Hankow, 18 July (Hsin-hua) -- Almost all the KMT bandits in the 33 hsien of southern Hunan have been suppressed and the whole area has been secured.

The Hunan mountains have always been infested with local bandits. After the liberation of the province by our troops, KMT remnants have been using these mountains as their hideouts to carry out anti-Communist activities with the cooperation of the local landowners. In 1949, it was estimated that some 70,000 KMT bandits and remnants were operating from these mountains.

The first campaign against the bandits was launched in December 1949 by our forces, resulting in the annihilation of some 10,000 former troops of the KMT New Eighth Army and over 20,000 troops of the KMT Rear Service Guerrilla Force. Subsequent attacks against the remaining bandits carried out during this year have completely wiped out these troops.

NANKING EXECUTES TWO KMT SPECIAL AGENTS -- Hong Kong Wen-hui Pao, 19 Jul 50

Nanking, 18 July (Hsin-hua) -- Wang Kuo-chen (8), head of the China Youth Anti-Communist League, and Chiang Yun-lung (9), leader of the Kiangsu-Chekiang-Anhwei People's Anti-Communist National Salvation Army, who were found guilty of subversive activities by the Nanking Municipal People's Court, on 25 June 1950, were executed recently by the Nanking authorities.

It is said that Wang was a special representative of Chiang Ching-kuo. He infiltrated into Nanking in July 1949 and, misrepresenting himself as a staunch supporter of the CCP regime, managed to have himself appointed as an official of the Nanking People's government. Under cover, however, he was secretly organizing a KMT special agent organization within the government to undermine its activities. He and his henchmen were uncovered by the Public Security Bureau and placed under arrest on 13 February 1950.

The Kiangsu-Chekiang-Anhwei People's Anti-Communist National Salvation Army commanded by Chiang Yun-lung was, in reality, a KMT military special agent organization. It was organized in August 1949 by Chiang and another person named Chiang Ch'eng-lin (10), also a KMT special agent, to place a number of KMT special agents in various key positions of rural people's governments. The purpose of the organization was not only to obtain secret government information but to undermine the attempts of our leaders to restore peace and order.

The members of this organization were, for the most part, former KMT officials and military personnel, and have been actively engaged in spreading false rumors regarding our people's government. Many of them joined up with the various popular organizations and have been soliciting the support of former KMT members. Chiang and 54 other leaders of this organization were placed under arrest by the Public Security Bureau on 20 March 1950, together with a number of seals, documents, arms, etc., which were used to prove their guilt.

GUERRILLAS HARASSING CCF IN HONAN -- Hong Kong Hsing-tao Jih-pao, 31 Jul 50

Taihoku, 30 July -- Reports from Honan indicate that the KMT guerrillas are continuing to harass the Chinese Communist forces stationed in this province.

On 22 July 1950, ten Chinese Communist military vehicles loaded with supplies and men were blown up by land mines laid by the guerrillas, killing or injuring more than 100 Chinese Communist troops. A party of CCF officials sent out to investigate the incident was waylaid by the guerrillas and a number of these officials were killed.

It is further reported that the Nationalist flag is beginning to make its appearance everywhere in the countryside, which indicates that the rural inhabitants are opposed to the CCP regime.

KWANGTUNG COASTAL AREA GUERRILLAS RESUME ACTIVITIES -- Hong Kong Kung-shang-Jih-pao, 24 Jul 50

Hui-chou, 23 July -- As a result of the departure of the Chinese Communist forces, which were stationed in the Hai-feng, Lu-feng, and Hui-lai areas in Kwangtung, for Hui-chou to await orders for eventual transfer to the north, the KMT guerrillas in these areas are resuming their activities.

On 21 July 1950, some 300 KMT guerrillas aided by more than 100 local inhabitants, who have been opposing the CCP regime, attacked Lu-feng. They captured a number of Chinese Communist officials. It is said that the majority of the local people's government officials went into hiding, while the guerrillas distributed anti-Communist pamphlets and slogans.

It is said that plans are now being made by the Chinese Communist officials to send the units of the Liang-kuang Column to aid the local public security bureaus in combating the guerrillas operating in these areas.

MAO-MING KMT GUERRILLAS ATTACK CCF -- Hong Kong Kung-shang Jih-pao, 10 Jul 50

Mao-ming -- About 400 KMT guerrillas of the Southern Kwangsi Command Post, 23d Detachment, Kwangtung-Kwangsi Border Region Anti-Communist National Salvation Self-Defense Army, launched a surprise attack against the Chinese Communist forces stationed at Shih-ch'i, Mao-ming Hsien, during the first part of June 1950. They killed more than 200 Communist troops and captured 112 rifles and several thousand rounds of ammunition.

They are part of the 3,000 KMT guerrillas operating in the Mao-ming, Hsin-i, Wu-ch'uan, and Tien-pai areas commanded by Huang Hsien-liang.

KMT GUERRILLAS ACTIVE AGAIN IN LUNG-MEN AREA -- Hong Kong Kung-shang Jih-pao, 10 Jul 50

Lung-men -- Two KMT guerrilla units, one commanded by Chung Hsiao-wen and the other by Li Kuo-chun, which have been hiding out in the mountain areas of Nan-k'un since the first part of June 1950 to avoid annihilation by the Chinese Communist forces, have emerged from their hideouts and are again engaged in anti-Communist activities in the Lung-men area.

These units, numbering about 300 men, now control Tao-ma-ling, Ma-an-shan, and Lu-t'ien areas in Kwangtung and have recently recaptured T'ieh-kang. They are taxing the local inhabitants of these areas to maintain the troops,

TAIWAN SENDS KMT OFFICERS TO LEAD GUERRILLAS IN KWANGTUNG -- Hong Kong Kung-shang Jih-pao, 28 Jul 50

Canton, 27 July -- It is reported that the Taiwan KMT authorities recently dispatched a number of KMT officers to the Chu Chiang area in Kwangtung to lead the guerrillas in their fight against the Chinese Communist forces. For the most part, plans are being made by these guerrillas to intensify their activities of disrupting the Chinese Communist communications system, especially railroads, and waterways.
