HUNGARIAN WORKERS GET SOCIALIST HERO OF WORK AWARDS

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On 24 October 1953, the Presidium of the Hungarian People's Republic conferred the title of Hero of Socialist Work (Szocialista Munka Hose) on outstanding workers in various fields.

The names of the workers and pertinent biographic information are given below.

Andor Bihari, director of the Budapest Oxygen Factory (Budapesti Oxigengyar) since 1948, began his career as a metalworker. He studied and learned engineering in the field of oxygen manufacturing. His innovations and solutions to various technical problems saved the factory between 7 and 8 million forints in 1951 and 1952.

Ede Horvath, director of the Gyor Machine Tool Factory (Gyori Szerszameggyar) is a Kossuth Prize winner. Horvath's skillfull leadership is largely responsible for the fact that the factory fulfilled the plan and improved the quality of its products despite the high percentage of unskilled labor employed.

Arpad Loy, master miner of Borsod Coal Mining Trust (Borsodi Szenbanyaszati Troszt), has kept alive work competition. The enthusiasm and ingenuity of this famous Stakhanovite has helped his brigade achieve outstanding production.

Peter Mausz, technical director of the Diosgyor Machine Factory (Diosgyori Gepgyar) is a conscientious worker and innovator. He has solved problems related to the manufacture of crankshafts for the 275-horsepower locomobile, for which he received a 3,000-forint bonus in January 1953. Recently he was awarded the Bronze Medal of Merit.

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Matyas Misloczky, chief smelter of the electrosteel shop of the Lenin Metallurgical Works (Lenin Kohaszati Muvek), is an excellent teacher and trainer of Stakhanovites. He became a Stakhanovite and received the Kossuth Prize in 1952.

Ignac Pioker is a Stakhanovite lather as well as a Kossuth Prize winner. He introduced Soviet work techniques at the United Incandescent Factory (Egyesult Izzo Gyar) and has consistently increased his productivity.



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
